Dear Senate Committee on Housing and Development:

I am writing to express my major concerns re. SB 1537.

I have worked my entire professional life administering community mental and public health services and programs.

With that experience, my own observations in the major cities of Oregon, and having lost a friend to homelessness -- I am well aware of the crisis we are facing. I am very excited and pleased that our government officials have recognized homelessness as a priority and are proposing actions to address this issue.

That said, though I appreciate the LACK of HOUSING being recognized as a major aspect of this crisis, I do not believe measures simply allowing the expansion of

our hard-fought-for URBAN GROWTH BOUNDARIES is a right solution: .. Almost all urban areas have already existent un-/under-- utilized land within their CURRENT UGB's to allow for appropriate housing development.

.. The broad-stroke permissiveness of the current proposal for expanding UGB's will undermine Oregon's decades-long successful effort to rein in inappropriate development.

.. If such a generalized solution was to be approved, it would establish a precedent for both encroaching on lands not appropriate for such development AND

weakening the very laws and restrictions that have made Oregon a national model for appropriate and sensitive Land Use (vs. "ABUSE").

As you consider this important issue, I urge You to consider both alternatives and amendments that will encourage affordable housing development for the unhoused while maintaining our current land safeguards.
