I oppose this bill to make standard time permanent in the PST region of the state.

- 1) From March to November, we would be 2 hours behind MDT time Oregon (as well as other nearby states) and we would be an hour behind PDT states and 4 hours behind the east coast. This would have negative impact on our economy.
- 2) We would get a sunrise at 4:22 AM in June. That would be a tragic waste of sunlight as most people are asleep at that time. Having spent time in Alaska during the summer, I also know that this early daylight can be disruptive to sleep and will also have negative economic consequences due to health and wellness compromises.
- 3) Year round DST was tried in 1974. It didn't work out for reasons I'm sure you are already aware of. Those reasons are still valid today.

I could support a permanent time tied to PDT, but not PST.
