

Aisle 13 – Walmart. That's where I was approached by a couple that asked me if I was still helping the Woodburn Family Learning Center. I said I was and they said, "we got to keep that place open, it's an icon of Woodburn" Then they walked away. Challenge accepted. We will keep the Center open.

Keeping the Center open has been challenging as the majority of our families are considered low income and we receive payments from DHS for their tuition. These tuition payments are a set amount and we are constantly thinking of ways to operate on restrictive budget. As a non-profit organization, we have welcomed businesses and individuals to help us succeed and we have found this to be powerful. For instance, we invited the Woodburn Rotary to assist us and they gave us a large donation that was used to purchase LED lights for our building (along with the savings from Smart Watt). Woodburn Rotary also brought a team to paint some rooms and build mini golf holes that were used at our annual fundraiser. Woodburn Kiwanis moved 10 yards of wood chips to our playgrounds. A local dentist came on his day off and built a playground for the kids. A chiropractor came on his lunch break and helped with the kitchen remodel. A farmer gave a large donation so we could purchase a commercial stove. In the past 6 years, we have had over \$200,000 given to improve the Woodburn Family Learning Center.

It is vital that we continue to improve the Woodburn Family Learning Center facility. Our building was built in 1978 and security upgrades and improvements of the building are needed to keep this building funcitonal. We are currently serving 59 children and further expansion will allow us to serve 80 children.


