## **Subject: Marion County Commissioner Kevin Cameron Supports Funding for the Cottage United Project**

As a board member of the United Way of the Mid-Willamette Valley and Marion County Commissioner, I am writing to express my strong support for the funding of the United Way of the Mid-Willamette Valley's Cottages United Project. This initiative, targeted at seniors aged 55 and above, is a vital step towards addressing the pressing need for affordable housing for seniors in the Salem-Keizer area.

The Cottages United Project aims to provide 25 low-income cottages with a maximum monthly rent of \$500. As a Marion County Commissioner, I have seen firsthand the impact of homelessness on our community. Affordable housing is a critical component of addressing homelessness in our state, and initiatives like the Cottages United Project represent tangible steps towards providing sustainable solutions.

The United Way of the Mid-Willamette Valley has demonstrated its commitment to serving our community's needs, including the need for more low-barrier shelter space. I believe that supporting the Cottages United Project is not only a wise investment in addressing senior homelessness but also a testament to our collective dedication to creating a more equitable and compassionate society.

I urge your support for funding for the United Way of the Mid-Willamette Valley's Cottages United Project. By doing so, we can make a meaningful difference in the lives of seniors in our community and pave the way for innovative solutions to housing insecurity.
