Dear Co-Chair Holvey, Co-Chair Girod and members of the committee:

I am writing to you to support HB 5201 in support of the new baseball stadium at the Fair Grounds in Eugene. This can be a very controversial subject, as I wish to support for the stadium project.

The Eugene Emeralds bring in about \$100 million in revenue to Lane County each year. Money that will be easily replaced if the team were to be relocated. The team charitable works go far beyond almost organization for which I know and this cannot be easily replaced.

The Lane County fairgrounds are in desperate need of upgrading. In the past thirty years I've seen the fairgrounds deteriorate from healthy to disrepair. This project would help make vital repairs and would make the fairgrounds much more viable than it is presently and not just for baseball fans but for others who could come to this multi-use stadium and the other parts of the fairgrounds.
