Please keep Oregon competitive in forestry economics. Rising taxes will get passed down to secondary manufactures and businesses making it harder to compete. 90 percent of what we manufacture is bought in Oregon and sold outside Oregon boarders. Taxing Oregon timber will drastically impact our advantage to local lumber supply, pushing our raw material supply outside of Oregon raising transportation cost.

I strongly oppose SB 1593. This bill claims to study a way to fund wildfire but the Legislature already funded a quarter of a million dollar study on wildfire funding in 2020. We don't need another costly study.

This isn't even a true exercise in academic study – it's a lopsided attempt to gather information that will help one legislator make a case for increasing taxes on the timber industry in 2025.

The Private Forest Accord legislation (2022) was very costly for the timber industry and the full effects of it are only just being felt. And according to recent economic research, Oregon's timber industry is already taxed at a much higher rate than other businesses.

Please oppose this poorly conceived bill.
