The dash 1 amendment to this bill may be one of the most undemocratic measures to be heard in Oregon in recent history. The goal of this amendment is to deny citizens of a vehicle to check elected officials when oppositional testimony is ignored. The process for UGB expansion in local venues can already be inordinately driven by developers and speculators with resources, and process knowledge. Local citizens deserve the right to exercise their vote in the wake of officials deeming special interests' opinions over the people.

Local officials currently can disregard the testimony of citizens and referendum may be the last resort to check executive overreach.
