RE: House Bill 4145 A-Engrossed

Dear Chair Prozanski, Vice-Chair Thatcher, and Committee Members:

The Oregon Veterinary Medical Association supports House Bill 4145 A-Engrossed

In 2019, the U.S. Congress unanimously approved landmark animal welfare regulation to outlaw the cruel and inhumane act of animal crushing. The Preventing Animal Cruelty and Torture Act (PACT) revised and expanded federal crimes with regards to animal crushing.

Earlier this year, a Prineville man pleaded guilty to conspiracy to produce and distribute videos depicting the torture, mutilation and crushing of monkeys in exchange for money through an online chat group. This bill would help to close any gaps in Oregon's law by establishing new animal cruelty crimes with respect to animal crushing and visual recording of such heinous acts.

House Bill 4145 A-Engrossed also provides important safeguards to ensure it appropriately targets bad actors without incidentally ensnaring other groups. It specifically excludes any customary and normal veterinary agricultural husbandry practice; the slaughter of animals for food; hunting; fishing; pest control; wildlife management; medical and scientific research, etc.

We urge your support of this important legislation and thank you for your time and consideration.
