<b>Membership Organization (501c4 or 501c5 only)</b>	<p>\$33,000 to statewide candidate, twice during election year</p> <p>\$16,500 to other candidate, twice during election year</p> <p>PLUS:</p> <p>To any statewide candidate per year: 36 FTE months of "in-kind personal services," which can include professional services apart from recent campaign consultants. Example: Organization can hire 3 professional organizers, pay each one \$150,000 per year, and donate their full services to a statewide candidate for a year (value = \$450,000). If the candidate files in the year before the election year, this contribution can be made twice, equal to a value of \$900,000 to the candidate.</p> <p>To any other candidate per year: 12 FTE months of "in-kind personal services," which can include professional services other than recent campaign consultants. Example: Organization can hire 3 professionals, pay each one \$150,000 per year, and donate their full services to a non-statewide candidate for 4 months (value = \$150,000).
