Dear Senator Girod, Representative Holvey, and Members of the Subcommittee on Capital Construction

As a mission-driven, member-based trade association comprising over 90 dedicated affordable housing developers and allies, Housing Oregon has been advocating for and supporting the development of affordable housing across our state. We urge you to consider a dedicated investment of \$5M-\$15M towards building affordable homes for homeownership under HB 5203.

Homeownership represents more than a roof over one's head; it's a cornerstone of stability and security for Oregon's families. The proposed funding will serve as crucial gap financing, enabling shovel-ready projects to break ground across the state. Developers like Habitat for Humanity, ProudGround, and Rooted Homes are poised to turn these investments into tangible outcomes—homes sold at nearly half the market rate, directly addressing the affordability crisis and making the dream of homeownership a reality for many who are currently sidelined in our housing market.

The absence of this timely support risks not only the delay of critical housing projects but the potential loss of affordable homeownership opportunities in areas desperately needing them:
