#### Work Session

- HB 2164 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Appropriates moneys to the State Department of Agriculture for purposes related to a program of state inspection for the processing and sale of meat products from nonamenable species.
- HB 2166  
Requires the State Department of Agriculture to submit a report on the economic competitiveness of Oregon's agricultural sector to a committee or interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to natural resources no later than December 31, 2026.
- HB 2168 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Instructs the Oregon State University Extension Service to establish a program for providing assistance to households that rely on wells for drinking water or on septic systems for wastewater treatment.

#### Public Hearing

- HB 2356  
Adds lands to a metropolitan service district when those lands are within Metro's urban growth boundary and annexed by a city in Metro.
- HB 3013  
Details the process by which a permit or zone change that is based on provisions of a comprehensive plan or land use regulation that fail to gain acknowledgment is voided and any resulting improvements or uses are removed or revoked.
- HB 2256  
Exempts the seller and the nonprofit purchaser of property for conservation purposes from civil or criminal liability for selling units of land not lawfully established.
- HB 2135  
Allows battery-charged fences on properties not used as residences.
- HB 2557  
Prohibits a person from raising octopus for the purpose of human consumption or participating in the sale or offer for sale of octopus that was raised for human consumption.
