The following bill is scheduled solely for the purpose of moving it to another committee.

Work Session

HB 3051

Directs the Oregon Health Authority to study fitness to proceed and requires the authority to provide the results of the study to the appropriate interim committees of the Legislative Assembly no later than May 1, 2026.

Public Hearing

HB 2748

Prohibits a nonhuman entity from using the title "nurse" or other similar titles.

HB 2789

Prohibits the Oregon Health Authority under specified circumstances from requiring, as a condition of reimbursing the cost of the service, a primary care provider to order a covered care management service provided by a licensed registered nurse to a medical assistance recipient.

HB 3220

Directs the Oregon State Board of Nursing to adopt rules to require a certain student-to-faculty ratio in the clinical component of nursing education programs.

HB 2948

Provides that only a registered nurse may supervise a nurse in a school setting with respect to the practice of nursing.

HB 2143

Defines "five-needle protocol.

HB 3221 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires a person or government unit that is establishing or operating an urgent care center in this state to register the urgent care center with the Oregon Health Authority.

HB 3127

Requires medical certifiers and medical examiners to use the state electronic reporting system to report deaths to the Center for Health Statistics.

HB 2318 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to review studies on temperature excursions during the transit of mail order drugs.
