Public Hearing

HB 3439

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 02/27/25 MEETING: Requires individual and group health benefit plans and benefit plans offered by the Public Employees' Benefit Board and the Oregon Educators Benefit Board to reimburse services provided by naturopathic physicians within the scope of their practice if the services are reimbursed when provided by licensed physicians, physician associates or nurse practitioners.

HB 2206 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to convene a work group to study the feasibility of and develop a plan for transferring responsibility from the authority to coordinated care organizations to administer adult residential mental health service benefits and assume the financial risk of administering those benefits.

HB 2224

Modifies the membership of the metrics and scoring subcommittee of the Health Plan Quality Metrics Committee to include a member with expertise in public health or population health data.

HB 2317

Requires the governing body of a coordinated care organization to include at least one representative of a federally qualified health center and at least one senior public health official.

HB 3229 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs the Oregon Health Authority to expedite the process for enrolling providers in the medical assistance program and study the feasibility of developing and implementing an automated, online tool for provider enrollment applications.

- HB 2210 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Expands a provider credentialing database maintained by the Oregon Health Authority to include audit or other compliance materials that an organizational provider must submit to a coordinated care organization.
- HB 3245
Directs the Oregon Health Authority to develop a methodology for calculating a coordinated care organization's global budget.
- HB 2214
Modifies the minimum financial requirements for coordinated care organizations.
- HB 2205
Extends the term of a contract entered into between the Oregon Health Authority and a coordinated care organization to 10 years.
- HB 2215 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Establishes a process for determining global budgets for coordinated care organizations that is similar to the rate review process for insurers.
- HB 2209 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Establishes new criteria and a new process for proposed amendments to contracts entered into between the Oregon Health Authority and coordinated care organizations.
- HB 2208
Requires a community health improvement plan to serve as the primary regional planning document for all health services and operations and incorporate various other planning documents.
