HB 3819 is scheduled solely for the purpose of moving it to another committee.

Work Session

HB 3819

Allows the State Board of Massage Therapists to issue a registration to practice reflexology to a qualified applicant.

HB 3211

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to develop and make available a nonopioid directive form.

Public Hearing

HB 3146 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means Directs the Oregon Health Authority to administer a pilot program to provide low-barrier emergency housing for houseless or unsafely housed individuals on waiting lists for residential substance use disorder treatment or withdrawal management programs.

HB 2211

Defines a "dental subcontractor.

HB 2597 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means Directs the Oregon Health Authority and coordinated care organizations to reimburse dental care organizations for dental services provided to medical assistance recipients at a rate no less than 59.

HB 2057

Prohibits insurers offering policies or certificates of health insurance and pharmacy benefit managers from requiring that a claim for reimbursement of a prescription drug include a modifier or other indicator that the drug is a 340B drug.

HB 2385

Makes it an unlawful practice for drug manufacturers to interfere directly or indirectly with a pharmacy or drug outlet acquiring 340B drugs, delivering 340B drugs to certain health care providers or dispensing 340B drugs.

HB 3511 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs the Oregon Health Authority to develop and implement a program to award grants to community-based organizations to conduct a public health campaign on the negative health effects of using betel nuts.

HB 2239 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs the Oregon Health Authority to adopt minimum quality and performance standards to certify recovery residences that contract with the authority, a coordinated care organization or a county behavioral health department to provide housing supports to individuals with substance use disorders.

HB 3650 **

Establishes the Latino Health System Task Force.

HB 3214

Expands the definition of "debilitating medical condition" for the medical use of marijuana.
