Possible Reconsideration and Work Session

HB 2147

Provides funding to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission to be distributed to Oregon Health and Science University for purposes of the Addiction Medicine Fellowship program.

HB 3294 is scheduled solely for the purpose of moving it to another committee.

Work Session

HB 3294 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study the effects of House Bill 2697 (2023).

HB 2013

Includes outpatient facilities that employ certified alcohol and drug counselors as providers for the purposes of mental health treatment insurance coverage.

HB 2015 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study outdated language in the provisions of ORS chapters 414 and 430.

HB 2056 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study the cost of community mental health programs.

HB 2205

Extends the term of a contract entered into between the Oregon Health Authority and a coordinated care organization to 10 years.

HB 2211

Defines a "dental subcontractor.

HB 2270 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs the Oregon Health Authority to increase by 30 percent the reimbursement rates for addiction medicine services.

HB 2387

Prohibits certain health professional regulatory boards from disciplining licensees for providing psilocybin services as licensed psilocybin service facilitators or for discussing psilocybin services with clients or patients.

- HB 2940 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Establishes the Task Force on Hemoglobinopathies and Sickle Cell Disease.
- HB 3221 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Requires a person or government unit that is establishing or operating an urgent care center in this state to register the urgent care center with the Oregon Health Authority.
- HB 3245
Directs the Oregon Health Authority to develop a methodology for calculating a coordinated care organization's global budget.
- HB 3380 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Revenue
Increases the tax credit allowed to rural volunteer emergency medical services providers from \$250 per tax year to \$1,000 per tax year.
- HB 3554 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Directs the Oregon Health Authority to establish a primary care provider loan repayment program to provide loan repayment subsidies to specified primary care providers.
- HB 3572 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Directs the Emergency Medical Services Program to develop a state emergency medical services 10-year strategic plan.
- HB 3761
Allows the Health Licensing Office to issue to a qualified applicant a license to practice art therapy as a provisional licensed art therapist.
- HB 3912
Requires an individual who uses the title "doctor" in connection with a health care profession to designate on specified material, including social media and professional name badges, the health care profession in which the individual earned a doctoral degree.
- HB 3650 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Establishes the Latino Health System Task Force.

Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

- HB 2212 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Establishes the Task Force on the Prioritized List of Health Services.
