Work Session

HB 2961

Increases the percentage of electrical service capacity for charging electric vehicles or electric vehicle charging stations that must be installed at vehicle parking spaces in the garages or parking areas of newly constructed commercial buildings, multifamily buildings with five or more units and mixed-use buildings consisting of privately owned commercial space and five or more residential dwelling units.

HB 3546

Directs the Public Utility Commission to provide for a classification of service for large energy use facilities.

HB 3081 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires the State Department of Energy to coordinate with other organizations, conduct outreach, establish a statewide navigation and support system and provide information in multiple languages, as part of the department's single resource for providing information and assistance related to available energy efficiency incentives and programs.

HB 3107

Modifies the authority of the Department of Environmental Quality to enter into agreements with regulated entities to expedite or enhance a regulatory process.

HB 2065

Allows a person to contract with a third-party consultant to conduct a study or engineering evaluation that a public utility requires for an application to interconnect a community renewable energy project or microgrid.

HB 2066

Directs the Public Utility Commission to establish a regulatory framework to allow the ownership, deployment and use of microgrids and community microgrids.

HB 3609

Requires each electric company to develop a distributed power plant program for the procurement of grid services to be provided by distributed energy resources.

HB 3681

Requires the Energy Facility Siting Council to conclude a contested case and issue a final order within 12 months from the date of a proposed order.

HB 2038 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires the State Department of Energy to study nuclear energy, including nuclear waste disposal from nuclear energy.

HB 2410 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Allows the Energy Facility Siting Council to issue a site certificate for a small modular reactor energy facility demonstration project in Umatilla County.

HB 3932

Instructs the State Fish and Wildlife Commission to adopt rules that prohibit a person from taking a beaver on waters or watersheds that are classified in a certain manner or on public land that is within the watersheds or within 200 feet of the ordinary high water mark of the waters.

HB 3119 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Transportation Prohibits the Department of Environmental Quality from implementing or enforcing the

Advanced Clean Trucks regulations before January 1, 2027.

Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

HB 3869

Requires the State Department of Energy, in collaboration with the Public Utility Commission, to study the benefits of a central energy procurement policy.

HB 3794 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means Establishes the Task Force on Municipal Solid Waste in the Willamette Valley.

HB 3944

Repeals provisions related to building code standards for wildfire hazard mitigation, defensible space requirements, fire protection for lands outside forest protection districts and the wildfire hazard map.

HB 3597

Requires the Department of Environmental Quality to study electric vehicles.

HB 3598

Requires the Department of Environmental Quality to study electric vehicles.
