HB 2050 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Revenue

Exempts from state income tax for a taxpayer who is a veteran all retirement pay or pension received for service in the Armed Forces of the United States.

HB 2152 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-3-2025 MEETING: Directs the State Department of Energy to develop and implement a Statewide Geographic Diversity of Fueling Stations for Disaster Reserves Priority Action Plan.

HB 2200 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-3-2025 MEETING: Directs the Oregon Investment Council and the State Treasurer to take certain actions to reduce the carbon intensity of state investments and address certain investment risks relating to climate change.

HB 2344

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-3-2025 MEETING: Requires the Department of Veterans' Affairs to keep the World War II memorial located in the Capitol Mall up to date and maintain an educational tool as part of the memorial.

HB 2559

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-3-2025 MEETING: Defines "honorable conditions" as related to the discharge or release of a veteran.

HB 2949 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-3-2025 MEETING: Requires the Department of Environmental Quality to contract with a third party to study and assess financial assurance requirements for owners or operators of bulk oils and liquid fuels terminals.

HB 2995 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-3-2025 MEETING: Establishes the Task Force on Reparations and directs the task force to study and develop proposals for financial and nonfinancial

reparations for Oregonians of African-American descent, develop appropriate methods for educating the public about the task force's findings and recommend appropriate remedies based on the task force's findings.

HB 3062

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-3-2025 MEETING: Requires local governments to map sensitive uses as part of a comprehensive plan.

HB 3450

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-3-2025 MEETING: Directs the State Department of Energy to develop an energy storage transition plan for the critical energy infrastructure hub.

HB 3460 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-3-2025 MEETING: Directs the Oregon Health Authority to administer a program to reimburse the cost of hyperbaric oxygen therapy for low-income veterans who have been diagnosed with traumatic brain injury or post-traumatic stress disorder and are ineligible for medical assistance.

HB 3532

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-3-2025 MEETING: Directs the Oregon Historical Society, in consultation with the Oregon Geographic Names Board, federally recognized Indian tribes, state and local government leaders, local landowners and other interested parties, to compile a list of highways and geographic features that bear offensive names.

HB 3556 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Revenue

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-3-2025 MEETING: Extends the permissible uses of net revenue from a new or increased local transient lodging tax to include public safety services and certain costs related to "community infrastructure.

HB 3646

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-3-2025 MEETING: Adds entities in which employees of the entity own at least 50 percent of the ownership interest in the entity directly or through an employee stock ownership plan to the list of sources to which a contracting agency may give preference in procuring goods or services for public contracts.

HB 3754 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-3-2025 MEETING: Directs the Oregon Department of Emergency Management to create and maintain a registry of persons who are able and willing to provide emergency volunteer services.

HB 3773

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-3-2025 MEETING: Requires the Oregon Health Authority to adopt by rule qualification criteria for veteran-specific personal health navigators as an additional category of traditional health workers.

HB 3654

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-3-2025 MEETING: Sets maximum matching fund requirements for state grants to small incorporated cities for capital construction and municipal infrastructure.

HB 2384

Extends the sunset date for the contingency planning fee and the tank railroad car fee.

HB 2658

Prohibits cities or counties from conditioning a permit or zoning change on the development of an improvement project that has already been financed, planned or approved.

HB 2753 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds under Article XI-Q of the Oregon Constitution for the emergency preparedness equipment grant program.

HB 2845 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Transportation then to Ways and Means

Requires an appropriation to the Department of Veterans' Affairs from the General Fund to be in an amount not less than \$10,000,000 in 2015 dollars, adjusted for inflation.

HB 2858 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Creates statewide preparedness offices in the Oregon Department of Administrative Services and the Oregon Department of Public Safety Standards and Training.

HB 2860

Directs the Oregon Military Department to study and make recommendations regarding improvements to the operations of the department.

Note Change: HB 2050, HB 2152, HB 2200, HB 2344, HB 2559, HB 2949, HB 2995, HB 3062, HB 3450, HB 3460, HB 3532, HB 3556, HB 3646, HB 3754, HB 3773, and HB 3654 have been added. HB 2834 and HB 3831 have been removed.

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
