#### Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

- HB 2469 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Establishes a time limit on when a district attorney may submit an indictment to the grand jury on a pending case when a trial date has been scheduled.
- HB 2639  
Modifies the process for setting aside convictions, dismissals, contempt of court findings and guilty except for insanity judgments.
- HB 2641  
Modifies when a prior conviction is admissible to impeach the character of a witness.
- HB 2712 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Provides that the Judicial Department may implement an audit schedule for the circuit courts.
- HB 3097  
Increases sentencing guidelines for felony attempting to elude a police officer.

#### Work Session

- HB 2471  
Modifies when a person is guilty except for insanity.
- HB 2473 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Modifies the requirements for providing a declaration for the purposes of authenticating records in response to criminal process.
- HB 2522 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Requires the use of headlights when the windshield wipers are on or there is fog.
- HB 2555  
Changes the name of the Family Sentencing Alternative Pilot Program to the Family Sentencing Alternative Program.
- HB 2975  
Provides that an admission or a finding that a crime constitutes domestic violence is not an element of the crime for merger purposes.

**Note change: HB 2471, HB 2473, HB 2522, and HB 2975 are now scheduled for a work session.**
