Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

HB 2632

Directs the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to study issues related to specialty courts, and to provide the results of the study to the appropriate interim committees of the Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2026.

HB 2633

Directs the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to study issues related to specialty courts, and to provide the results of the study to the appropriate interim committees of the Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2026.

HB 3816

Requires the Department of Justice to study victims.

HB 3917 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Creates the Catastrophic Wildfire Fund to pay for property damage claims arising from catastrophic wildfires that are ignited by the facilities of a public utility.

HB 2641

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/31/2025 MEETING: Modifies when a prior conviction is admissible to impeach the character of a witness.

HB 2639

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/31/2025 MEETING: Modifies the process for setting aside convictions, dismissals, contempt of court findings and guilty except for insanity judgments.

Work Session

HB 2055

Provides that when offering a service with age restrictions, a private entity is allowed to swipe a driver's license to verify a person's age, regardless of how old the person looks.

HB 2183

Directs the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to adopt rules providing that, if an applicant for certification as a private security professional is or was certified as a police officer, a refresher course and examination satisfies the training requirements for certification.

- HB 2677 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Modifies the procedure for the expunction of certain juvenile records.
- HB 3666
Requires an electric public utility to apply for a wildfire safety certification.
- HB 3766
Allows a plaintiff to bring a civil action against a person who transmits an intimate image to the plaintiff's computer or electronic device in certain circumstances.
- HB 2473 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/31/2025 MEETING: Modifies the requirements for providing a declaration for the purposes of authenticating records in response to criminal process.
- HB 2975
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/31/2025 MEETING: Provides that an admission or a finding that a crime constitutes domestic violence is not an element of the crime for merger purposes.
- HB 3174
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/31/2025 MEETING: Increases the fee paid for alcohol and drug screening specialists.
