Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

- HB 2467 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Defines "dangerous to self," "dangerous to others" and "serious physical harm" for the purpose of involuntarily committing a person with mental illness.
- HB 2488
Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study civil commitment criteria.
- HB 3884
Requires the Department of State Police to study whether firearm hold agreements reduce firearm risks.

Work Session

- HB 2306
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/2/2025 MEETING: Allows the Marion County board of county commissioners to establish a justice of the peace district that includes the county seat.
- HB 2311
Provides that the Oregon Health Authority is not required to use administrative law judges from the Office of Administrative Hearings for contested case hearings involving the Oregon State Hospital.
- HB 2492
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/2/2025 MEETING: Requires the State Court Administrator to study courts and submit findings to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to the judiciary not later than September 15, 2026.
- HB 2639
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/2/2025 MEETING: Modifies the process for setting aside convictions, dismissals, contempt of court findings and guilty except for insanity judgments.
- HB 3075
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/2/2025 MEETING: Modifies the firearm permit provisions of Ballot Measure 114 (2022).

- HB 3076 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/2/2025 MEETING: Directs the Department of Justice to study the establishment of a state gun dealer licensing program, and to provide the results of the study to the appropriate interim committees of the Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2026.
- HB 3093 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/2/2025 MEETING: Requires law enforcement agencies to take a DNA sample of a person arrested for certain crimes.
- HB 3666
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/2/2025 MEETING: Requires an electric public utility to apply for a wildfire safety certification.
- HB 3819
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/2/2025 MEETING: Allows the State Board of Massage Therapists to issue a registration to practice reflexology to a qualified applicant.
- HB 3929
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/2/2025 MEETING: Establishes a testimonial privilege for communications by certain public safety employees to a peer supporter.
