- HB 3589 A** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 05-06-2025 MEETING. Requires the Housing and Community Services Department to develop a senior housing development initiative.
- HB 3506 A** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 05-06-2025 MEETING. Transfers moneys from the Senior Property Tax Deferral Revolving Account to the Healthy Homes Repair Fund for the purpose of supporting seniors and individuals with disabilities.
- HB 3712
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 05-06-2025 MEETING. Changes the metrics for a homestead's real market value and the household income of a claimant in order to expand eligibility for the homestead property tax deferral program.

Public Hearing

- HB 2171 A
Provides that the tax collector for a camping site on a county fairgrounds that has not more than 50 camping sites with both direct electrical hookups and individual sewer hookups and that caters to tourists may withhold the state transient lodging tax collected for the camping site provided the tax moneys are used for the operation or promotion of the camping site.
- HB 3962
Requires the Legislative Revenue Officer to study issues of local taxation.
- HB 2977
Increases the state transient lodging tax.
