HB 3631 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs the Oregon Health Authority to establish a thriving youth pilot program to provide substance use prevention education through comprehensive out-of-school programming and access to specialized mental or behavioral health services to youth in 20 counties in this state.

Separates the possession, delivery and manufacture of fentanyl from general controlled substance offense statutes into separate statutes.

HB 2954 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Appropriates moneys from the General Fund to the Oregon Health Authority for distribution to local health departments and federally recognized Indian tribes in Oregon to provide addiction prevention services.

HB 3069

Requires the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to study public safety.

HB 2481

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study behavioral health.

HB 2488

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study civil commitment criteria.

HB 2476

Directs the Oregon Health Authority to study issues related to fitness to proceed and to provide the results of the study to the appropriate interim committees of the Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2026.

HB 3051

Directs the Oregon Health Authority to study fitness to proceed and requires the authority to provide the results of the study to the appropriate interim committees of the Legislative Assembly no later than May 1, 2026.
