HB 2997

Requires the Higher Education Coordinating Commission to establish a grant program for the purpose of supporting organizations to expand the scope and community reach of college access and success programs.

HB 2511

Directs the Department of Education to collect workforce data on all individuals who are employed by a school district or by an education service district.

HB 3449 A

Allows moneys available for a pilot program to provide support to foster child students to be used in other schools of the grantee's school district.

HB 2421 A

Includescertain private post-secondary institutions in the direct admissions program established by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission.

HB 2551 A

Directs the governing board of a public university toensure that background information about special campus security officers is requested from the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training and reviewed before commissioning the officer.

HB 2684 A

Requires that a school integrated pest management plan be reviewed at least once every five years and made available to the public on a website.

HB 3041

Modifies the source of law that establishes the Educator Advancement Council from intergovernmental agreement to state statute.

HB 3063

Provides that a student who is in a hospital educational program shall continue to remain enrolled in the school district in which the student had been a resident prior to being in the hospital educational program only for the purpose of maintaining access to classroom curricula and associated technology.
