#### **Work Session**

SB532

Requires dental insurers to follow certain rules for payment and denial of claims.

SB1162

> Requires an individual or entity to obtain a certificate of need from the Oregon Health Authority before the individual or entity may establish a new hospice program or expand or relocate a hospice program into a new service area.

SB 1188

Directs the Oregon Public Guardian and Conservator to establish a grant program to increase the availability of community-based guardianship programs and county public guardian and conservators for people with complex health care needs who are experiencing hospital discharge difficulties.

SB537

Creates workplace violence prevention requirements for certain health care entities.

SB

Establishes minimum amounts of reimbursement for primary care, optometry, dental care and behavioral health services provided to recipients of medical assistance.

SB598

> Requires certain health insurance providers and state managed medical assistance to use the same utilization review requirements for opioid and nonopioid drugs when they are prescribed for the same treatment.

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to conduct a study every two years to count the number of licensed and actively practicing primary care physicians in this state.

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to adopt rules for registering urgent care centers and specifies requirements.

SB 1001 \*\*

\*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Appropriates moneys from the General Fund to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services for distribution to the Coast Community Health Center to provide health care services and apprenticeships.

SB 1050 \*\*

\*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Appropriates moneys from the General Fund to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services for distribution to Southern Coos Hospital and Health Center to expand access to primary, specialty and pharmacy services in and around Bandon, Oregon.

### **Public Hearing**

SB 28

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study health care.

SB 824 \*\*

\*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires the Department of Consumer and Business Services to study federal laws and regulations affecting health insurance and evolving conditions in the insurance market that require periodic updates to state laws.

SB 40

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study public health.

SB 284

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study health care.

SB 286

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study hospital discharge challenges.

SB 535 \*\*

\*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires health insurance coverage of specified fertility services and treatments with exemption for certain insurers.
