- SB 24
Requires the Department of Corrections to study health care staffing by the department.
- SB 27
Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study the health care workforce in Oregon.
- SB 28
Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study health care.
- SB 40
Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study public health.
- SB 42
Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study vaccine financing.
- SB 283
Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study matters relating to the health care workforce in this state.
- SB 284
Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study health care.
- SB 286
Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study hospital discharge challenges.
- SB 532
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/03/2025 MEETING: Requires dental insurers to follow certain rules for payment and denial of claims.
- SB 535 **
Requires health insurance coverage of specified fertility services and treatments with exemption for certain insurers. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- SB 549
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/03/2025 MEETING: Prohibits the Oregon Health Authority and coordinated care organizations from requiring prior authorization for the repair of complex rehabilitation technology.

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- SB 699
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/03/2025 MEETING: Expands the health insurance coverage of prosthetic and orthotic devices.
- SB 772 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Establishes the Indian Health Scholarship Program to provide free tuition and fees for qualifying Indian health profession students in exchange for the student's commitment to work at a tribal service site after graduation.
- SB 824 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Requires the Department of Consumer and Business Services to study federal laws and regulations affecting health insurance and evolving conditions in the insurance market that require periodic updates to state laws.
- SB 942
Requires individual and group health benefit plans to cover a child over the age of 26 in certain circumstances.
- SB 1137
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/03/2025 MEETING: Requires health benefit plans to cover autologous breast reconstruction procedures and related services with specific requirements related to out-of-pocket costs, utilization review, reimbursement rates and network adequacy.
- SB 1060
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/03/2025 MEETING: Requires a hospital to establish, update and make public a list of standard charges that lists the regular rates or prices established by the hospital for items or services and shoppable services offered or provided by the hospital.
- SB 1161 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/03/2025 MEETING: Directs the Oregon Health Authority to issue licenses to enable a person to drive an organ transport vehicle.
- SB 1174
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/03/2025 MEETING: Directs the Health Licensing Office to issue a license to engage in the practice of nutrition to a qualified applicant.
- SB 716 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/03/2025 MEETING: Requires the Oregon Health Authority to adopt rules for registering urgent care centers and specifies requirements.
- SB 1181
Prohibits the increased cost or denial of a Medicare supplement insurance policy due to a preexisting condition and establishes open enrollment standards for Medicare supplement policies.
- SB 442 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/03/2025 MEETING: Establishes the COFA Shared Services Office to assist COFA citizens in applying for and accessing benefits and services.
