Transfers the office of Children's Advocate from the Department of Human Services to the office of the Long Term Care Ombudsman.

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Modifies the requirements for investigations of a residential care facility following a complaint of a licensing violation.

SB 34

> CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04-08-2025 MEETING: Requires the Department of Human Services to study long term care.

SB 136

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04-08-2025 MEETING: Authorizes the Department of Human Services to revoke a license, certificate or endorsement of a provider of community-based services to individuals with intellectual or developmental disabilities if the department deems the provider unqualified.

SB 611 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04-08-2025 MEETING: Establishes the Food for All Oregonians Program in the Department of Human Services to provide nutrition assistance to residents of this state who would qualify for the federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program but for their immigration status.

SB 741 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04-08-2025 MEETING: Directs the Department of Human Services to adopt a rate structure for foster parent compensation.

SB 909

> CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04-08-2025 MEETING: Directs the Oregon Health Authority to provide flexible and innovative home and community-based services and supports through the medical assistance program to children and youth that have a serious emotional disturbance.

SB 911

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04-08-2025 MEETING: Requires the Department of Human Services to adopt a methodology for payments made to providers of independent living transition services provided to foster children.

SB 915

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04-08-2025 MEETING: Directs the Director of Human Services to ensure that standards and procedures for the assessment and investigation of reports of child abuse committed by certain persons are investigated by a department program that specializes in training, investigations and safety.

SB 133

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04-08-2025 MEETING: Requires the Department of Human Services to study developmental disabilities services.

SB 725

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04-08-2025 MEETING: Directs the Department of Human Services to adopt by rule a minimum staffing ratio of 30 to 1 for service coordinators and personal agents serving individuals with intellectual or developmental disabilities.

Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

SB 1197

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04-08-2025 MEETING: Requires respite care services to be provided through the state medical assistance program to provide relief to unpaid caregivers of individuals under the age of 26 who have complex mental health or substance use-related needs.
