## **Public Hearing and Possible Work Session**

SB 149

Requires the Department of Human Services to study immigration.

SB 178

Provides that a district attorney may require the payment of a fee reasonably calculated to reimburse costs before providing discovery to a defendant.

## Work Session

SB 65

Allows a person who has been deprived of rights, privileges or immunities secured by the Oregon Constitution or the laws of this state by a person acting under color of law to bring a civil action for economic and noneconomic damages and for injunctive or other equitable relief.

SB 163

Requires the Judicial Department to study the judicial and administrative procedures to establish parentage and changes that would be necessary to implement the Uniform Parentage Act in this state.

## SB 174

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/3 MEETING: Provides that a violation of prohibitions against certain practices with respect to insurance is subject to an enforcement action under the Unlawful Trade Practices Act.

#### SB 176 \*\*

**\*\***Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Removes requirements that a registry identification cardholder who produces marijuana for personal medical use register with the Oregon Health Authority.

SB 180

Provides that a person may not bring an action for defamation against an individual who, without malice, makes a communication regarding an incident of sexual assault, harassment or discrimination if, at the time of making the communication, the individual has a reasonable belief that sexual assault, harassment or discrimination occurred.

# AGENDA (cont.) April 7, 2025

#### SB 181

Directs the State Department of Agriculture to study rules related to animals.

#### SB 238

Requires the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to study issues relating to law enforcement officers.

SB 243

Requires the Department of State Police to study the efficiency of firearm transfer criminal background checks.

#### SB 275

Directs the Department of Justice to study ways to address retail theft, and to provide the results of the study to the appropriate interim committees of the Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2026.

#### SB 424 \*\*

\*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Appropriates moneys from the General Fund to the Oregon Health Authority for an electronic filing system related to the Oregon Death with Dignity Act.

#### SB 469

Requires the State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision to study parole law in this state. SB 556

Allows a marijuana producer, marijuana wholesaler, marijuana processor or marijuana retailer to use a motion detection camera system at a licensed premises.

SB 558

Allows a marijuana licensee to provide samples of marijuana items to other marijuana licensees at temporary events registered with the Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission.

SB 926

Prohibits the recovery from customers of certain costs and expenses that an electric company incurs as a result of allegations of a wildfire resulting from the negligence or a higher degree of fault on the part of the electric company.

#### SB 1003

Modifies provisions relating to the Oregon Death With Dignity Act.

SB 1144

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/3 MEETING: Requires the Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission to study the amount of marijuana items that a marijuana retailer may sell.

SB 1173

Provides that a health care facility is not a manufacturer, distributor, seller or lessor of a product for purposes of a product liability civil action if the health care facility was not involved in the design or manufacture of the product.

SB 1186

Modifies provisions relating to the use of unmanned aircraft systems by law enforcement agencies.

#### Note change: SB 203, SB 429, SB 696, SB 697, and SB 698 removed.
