SB 195

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/8 MEETING: Requires the Department of Corrections to study best practices for confining people.

SB 243

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/8 MEETING: Requires the Department of State Police to study the efficiency of firearm transfer criminal background checks.

SB 469

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/8 MEETING: Requires the State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision to study parole law in this state.

SB 556

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/8 MEETING: Allows a marijuana producer, marijuana wholesaler, marijuana processor or marijuana retailer to use a motion detection camera system at a licensed premises.

SB 1003

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/8 MEETING: Modifies provisions relating to the Oregon Death With Dignity Act.

SB 1121

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/8 MEETING: Creates the crime of unlawful disclosure of private information.

SB 1173

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/8 MEETING: Provides that a health care facility is not a manufacturer, distributor, seller or lessor of a product for purposes of a product liability civil action if the health care facility was not involved in the design or manufacture of the product.

Note change: SB 195, SB 243, SB 469, SB 556, SB 1003, SB 1121, and SB 1173 added.
