Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

HB 2473 A

Modifies the requirements for providing verification for the purposes of authenticating records in response to criminal process.

HB 2492 A

Modifies the process for setting aside convictions, dismissals and contempt of court findings and guilty except for insanity judgments.

HB 3766 A

Allows a plaintiff to bring a civil action against a person who transmits an intimate image to the plaintiff's computer or electronic device in certain circumstances.

Work Session

HB 2008 A

Prohibits controllers from processing personal data for the purposes of targeted advertising, or selling personal data that pertains to a consumer, if the controller has actual knowledge, or disregards knowledge of whether, a consumer is under 16 years of age or if the personal data accurately identifies within a radius of 1,750 feet a consumer's present or past location or the present or past location of a device that links or is linkable to the consumer.

HB 2916

Modifies the qualifications of the fire instructor representative member of the Fire Policy Committee of the Board on Public Safety Standards and Training.

HB 2926

Allows the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to proceed with an investigation of, or action to deny the application for training or deny the certification of, a public safety officer or instructor notwithstanding a subsequent change in the employment status of the officer or instructor.

HB 2975 A

Provides that a pleading, an admission or a finding that criminal conduct constitutes a crime involving domestic violence is not an element of the crime for merger purposes.

May 12, 2025

HB 3825 A

Provides that judgment remedies for judgments of conviction in municipal and justice courts for the possession of less than one ounce of marijuana expire on the effective date of the Act.

Note change: HB 2614 A removed.
