HB 2306 A

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5/14 MEETING: Allows the Marion County board of county commissioners to establish a justice of the peace district that includes the county seat.

HB 2473 A

Modifies the requirements for providing verification for the purposes of authenticating records in response to criminal process.

HB 2522

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5/14 MEETING: Requires the use of headlights when the windshield wipers are on or there is fog.

HB 2614 A

Directs the Oregon Public Defense Commission to submit an agency request budget to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services after approval by commission members.

HB 2819 A

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5/14 MEETING: Authorizes the State Forester or a person authorized by the State Forester to issue citations if there are reasonable grounds to believe violations have occurred.

HB 3426 A

Expands offenses relating to the use of an unmanned aircraft system to interfere with official duties to include firefighting and search and rescue efforts.

HB 3564 A

Modifies provisions relating to demands for correction or retraction of a published defamatory statement.

HB 3766 A

Allows a plaintiff to bring a civil action against a person who transmits an intimate image to the plaintiff's computer or electronic device in certain circumstances.

HB 3816 A

Provides for 50 percent of awards of restitution ordered to an insurance carrier to be paid to the Department of Justice for purposes of victim services funding.

HB 3825 A

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5/14 MEETING: Provides that judgment remedies for judgments of conviction in municipal and justice courts for the possession of less than one ounce of marijuana expire on the effective date of the Act.

HB 3865 A

Prohibits as an unlawful practice under the Unlawful Trade Practices Act a person's initiating a telephone solicitation outside specified hours or more than three separate times within a 24-hour period, misrepresenting or falsifying the person's identity, the purpose of the call or the location from which the person is calling or failing to make required disclosures or inquiries during the call.

Note change: HB 2306 A, HB 2522, HB 2819 A, and HB 3825 A added.
