SB 904

Includes school districts among the self-insured employers that may apply for exemption from the rules requiring such employers to demonstrate financial viability and provide security to the Director of the Department of Consumer and Business Services.

SB 906

Requires that itemized statements provided to employees show, in plain language, the amount and purpose of each deduction.

SB 921

Requires the Oregon Business Development Department to study needed investments in shipyards.

SB 968

Provides requirements for employer deductions for erroneous overpayments of wages for employees who are not subject to a collective bargaining agreement.

Public Hearing

SB 430

Specifies disclosures that a retail seller must make to a retail buyer for a transaction in goods or services that concludes online by means of a website or other electronic method.

SB 569 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs the Oregon Business Development Department to establish a program to provide grants to nonprofit and community-based organizations that assist businesses owned by minority individuals to become certified by the Certification Office for Business Inclusion and Diversity as minority-owned businesses so that the certified businesses can compete effectively for public contracts.

SB 605 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Health Care

Prohibits medical service providers from reporting the amount or existence of medical debt to a consumer reporting agency.

SB 1044

Clarifies for purposes of state wage and hour laws that "work time" does not include meal periods.
