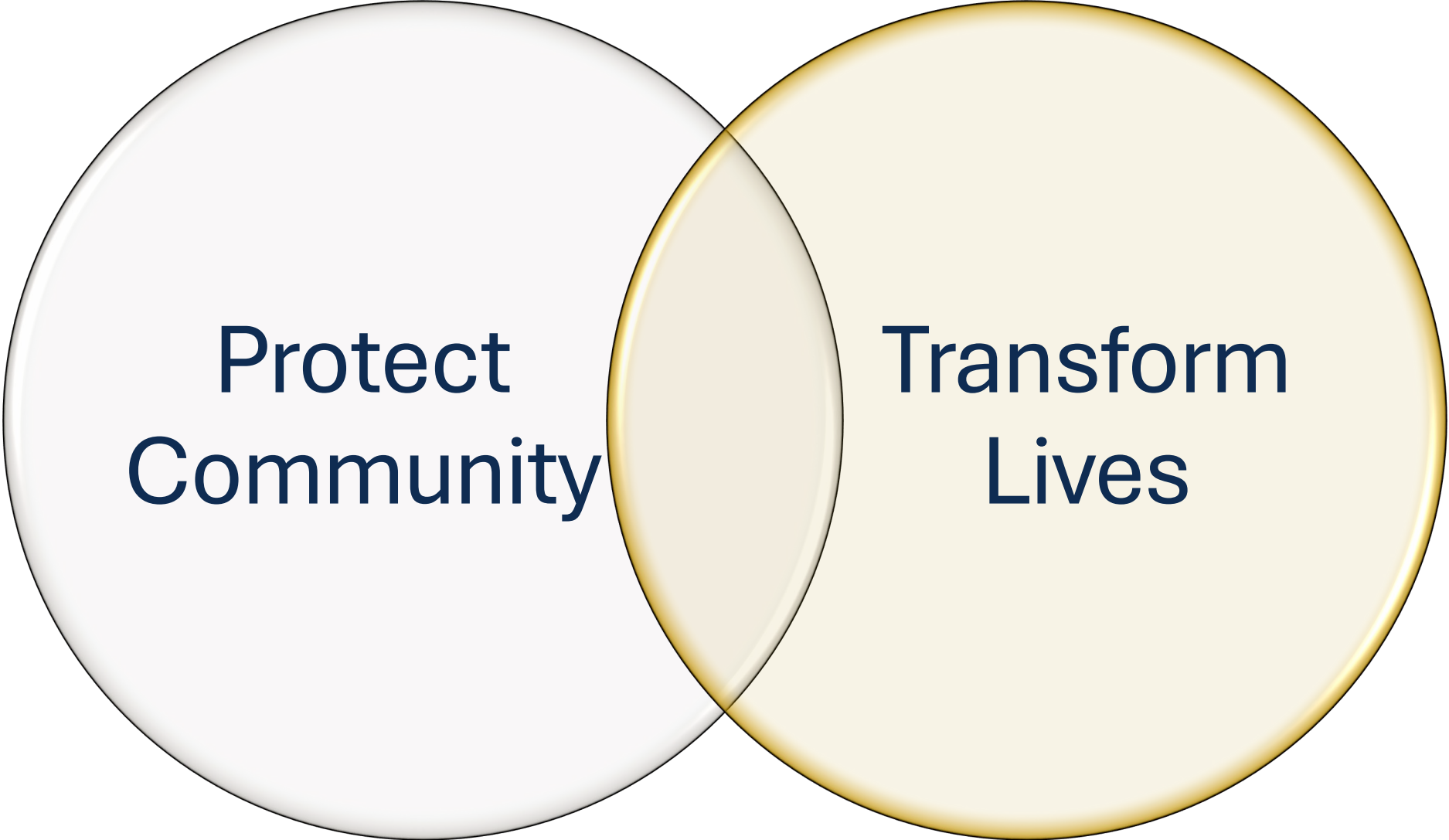

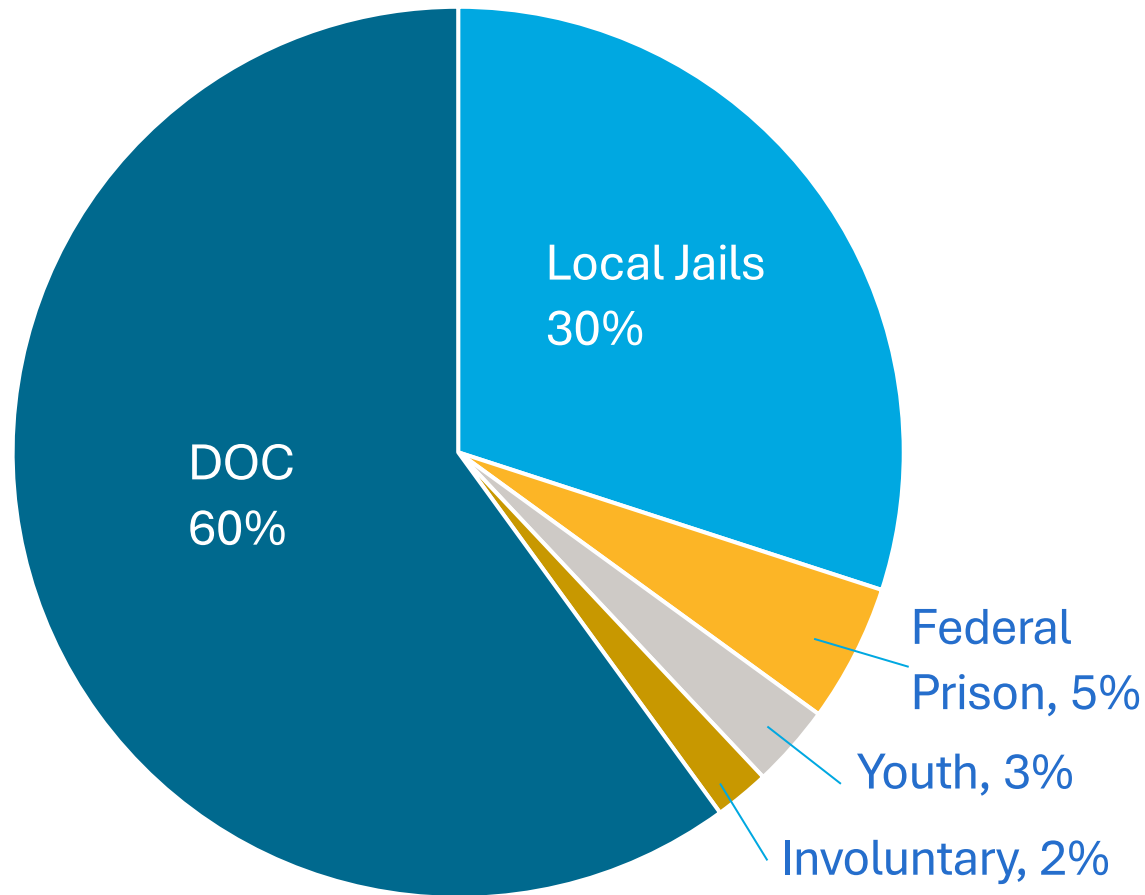

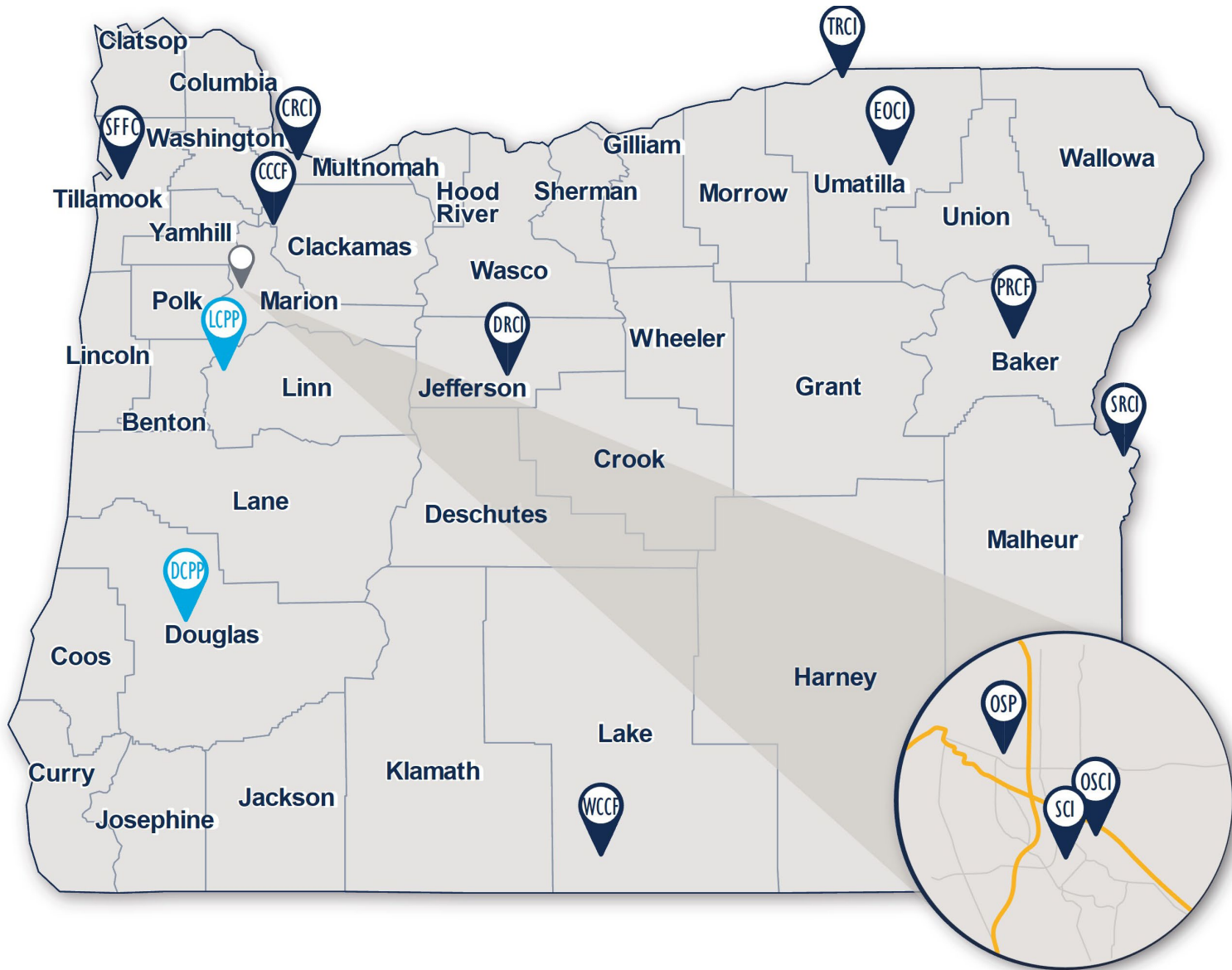


Oregon Incarcerated Population by Location



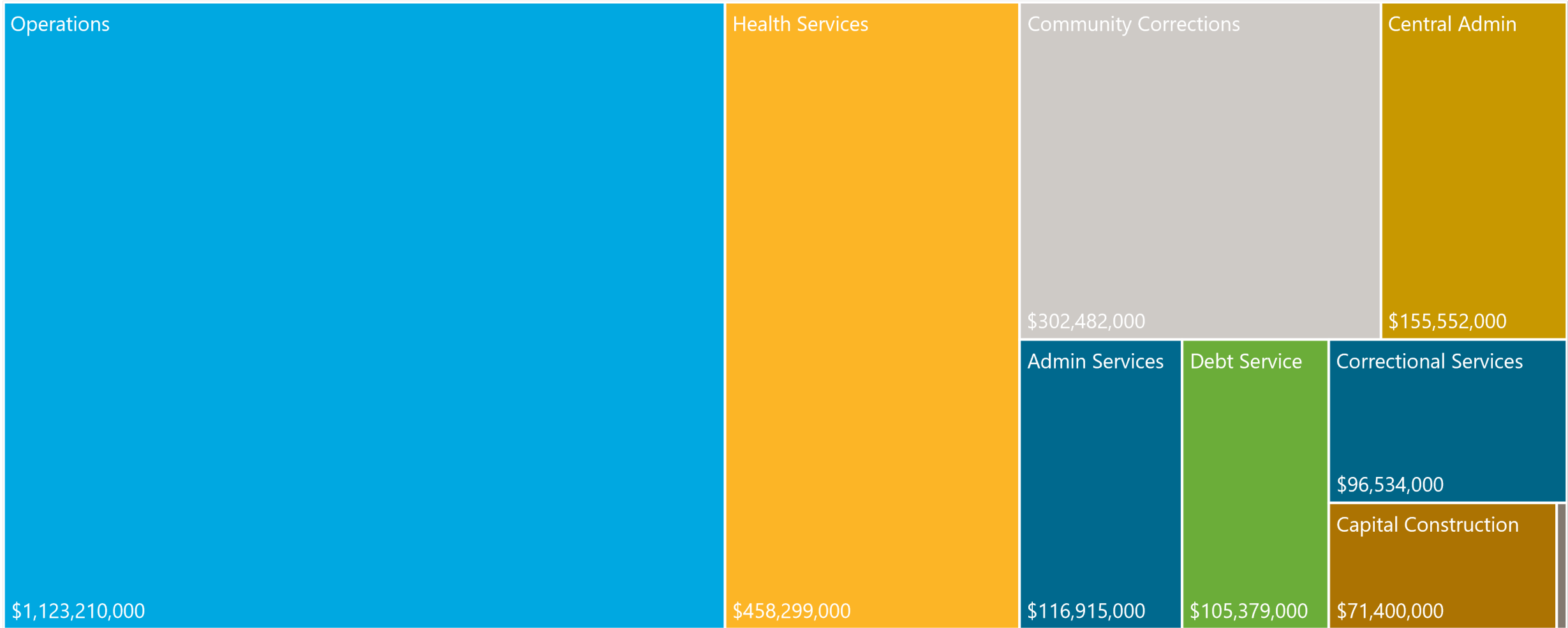
- DOC is responsible for the security, housing, rehabilitation, and daily operations of 12 prisons housing over 12,000 AICs.
- DOC employs about 4,500 personnel to support these 24/7 institutions.
- DOC oversees about 21,000 clients on supervision and operates two community corrections offices.

- The third largest state agency.



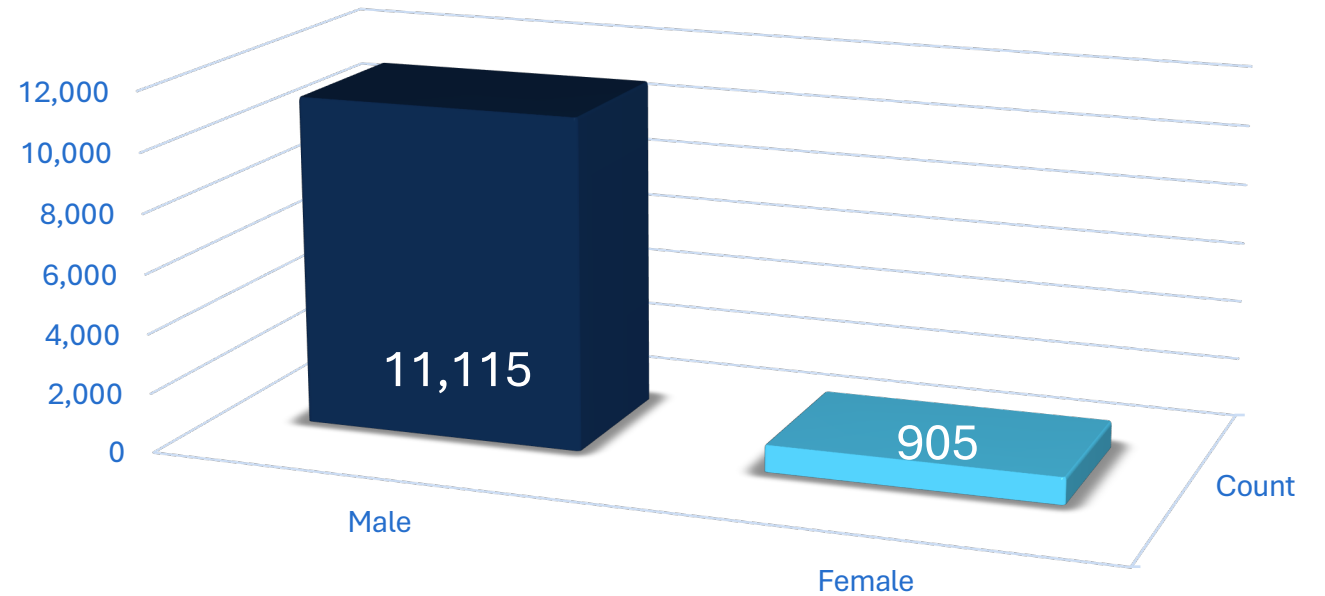

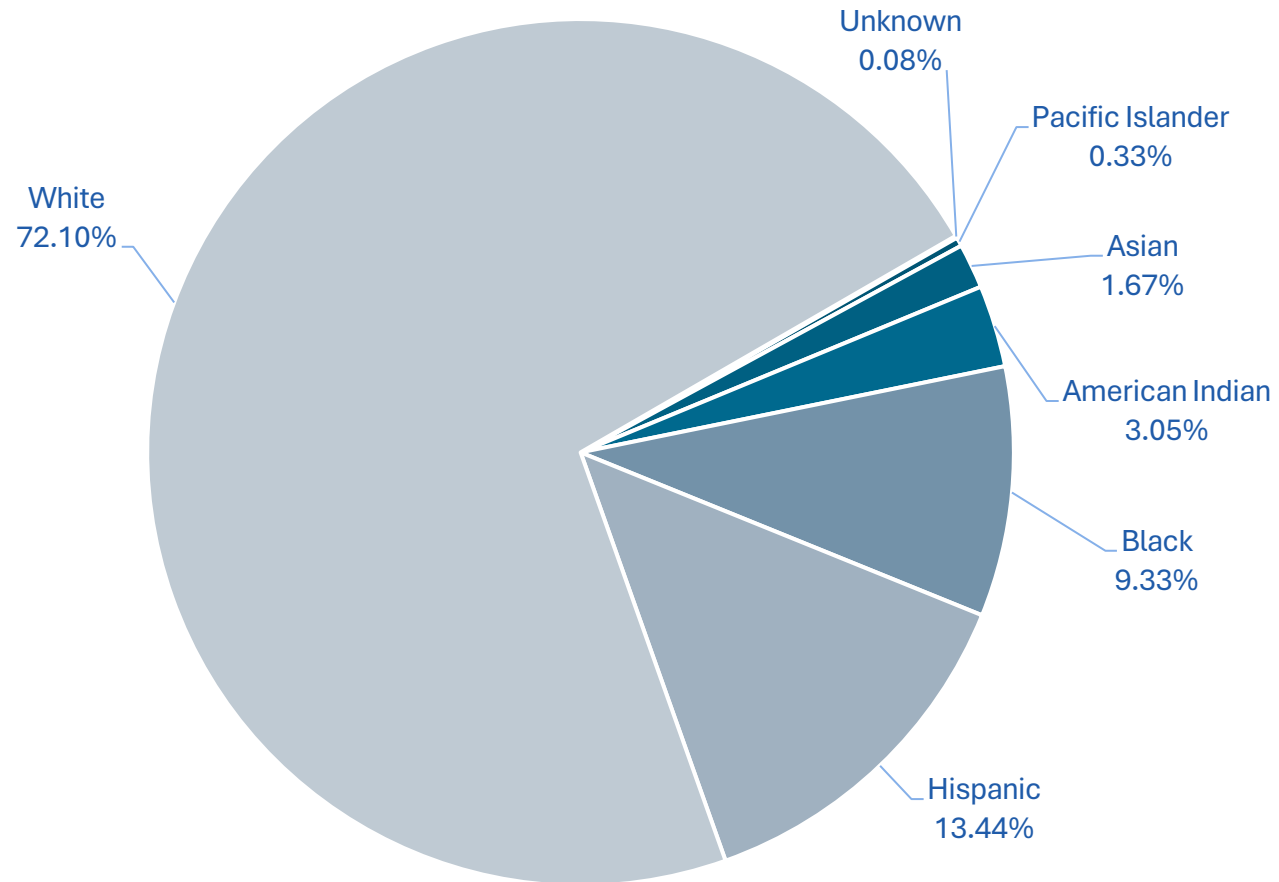


AIC Demographics: Gender



*as of December 2024.

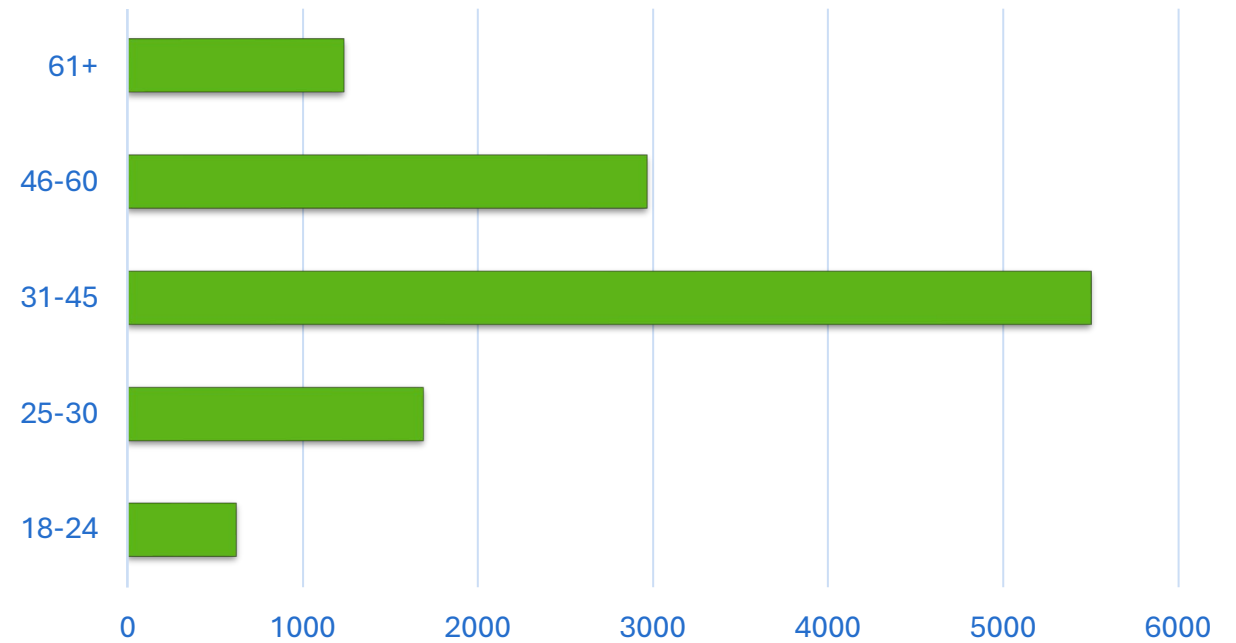
AIC Demographics: Race

Age Range of Oregon DOC's AIC Population

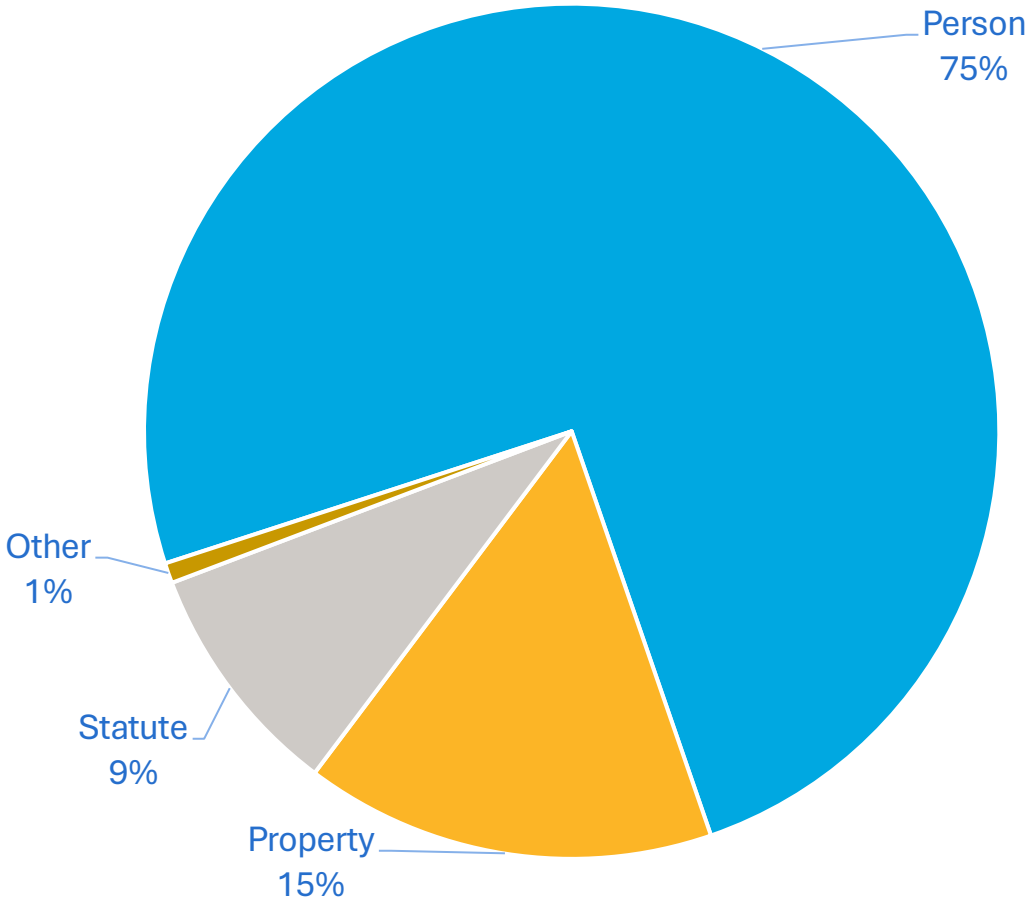


Our AICs are older than many people think, representing unique challenges to prisons designed for those who are younger.

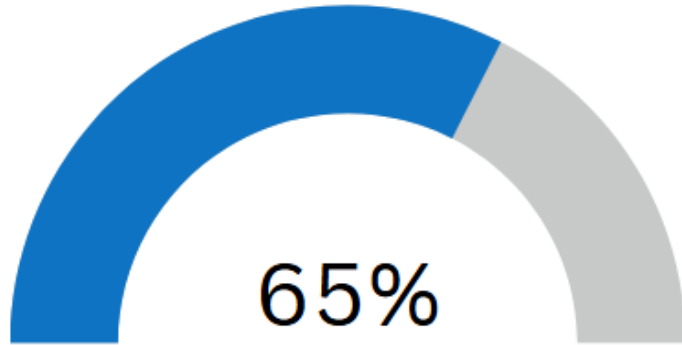
Criminal Histories



Type of Felony

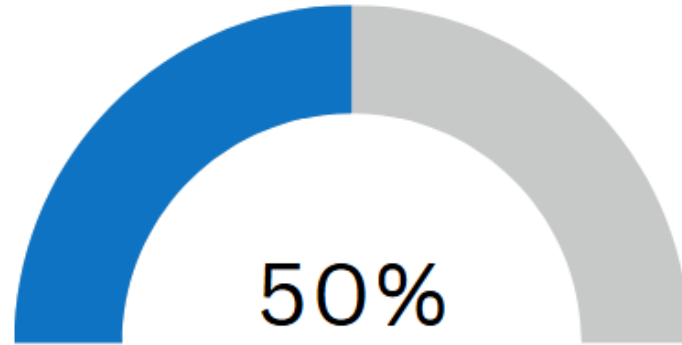

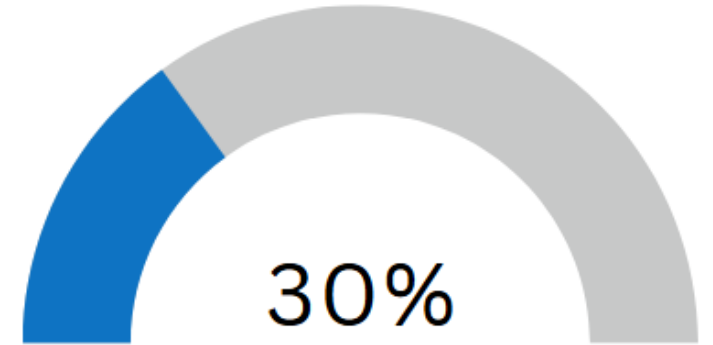

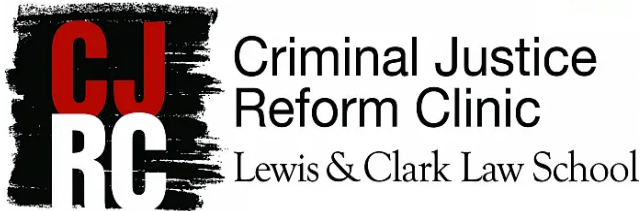
