
Who We Serve

 - Approximately 60,000 educators holding approximately 70,000 licenses and endorsements
 - Teachers (American Indian Language, elementary generalist, secondary subject area specialists, special educators, career and technical educators, English as a Second Language, etc.)
 - Administrators (assistant principals, principals, superintendents, other district admin)
 - Personnel Services (school counselors, school psychologists, school social workers)
- School district HR staff and superintendents
- Oregon educator preparation colleges and universities
- Patrons concerned about potential educator misconduct



Legislative Concepts

Bill	What Does It Do?	Why Does It Matter?	What Does It Cost?
SB 802	Moves beginning of 90-day grace period for educator applicants awaiting licensure FROM date of application submission TO date background check clears.	Better ensures student safety.	\$ 0
SB 804	Authorizes Commission to impose educator misconduct civil penalties of up to \$1000 per violation. AND If educator appeals and TSPC prevails at hearing, hearings officer may assign court costs, including attorneys' fees, to the educator.	Currently, all costs related to the investigation of educator misconduct are paid for by educator licensing fees. This will place a greater burden on those engaging in the misconduct while also serving as a deterrent. Expected to offset increasing DOJ costs for agency.	\$ O
SB 805	Reduces agency wait time for closure from 12 months to 6 months when complainant has been referred to resolve a complaint through district processes.	When the agency keeps as active complaints that have been resolved by districts, agency has inability to accurately assess caseloads.	\$0

Other "BIG" TSPC Work



- Educator Data System currently in development
 - Replaces current agency licensing system which has limitations for users and reporting
 - Designing to meet needs across all agency departments rather than only Licensing
 - Will go out for RFP soon
- Early Literacy Educator Preparation Standards Implementation
 - Collaborating with and supporting with all Oregon educator and preparation programs
 - Preparing for accompanying licensing requirements
