Key Takeaways

- Statewide community college FTE enrollment was up 7 percent for Fall 2024 and headcount enrollment was up 4.3 percent
- More students are enrolling in CTE and short-term certificate programs which lead to good careers and bolster the Oregon economy
- Community colleges need a budget increase of \$120m (\$920m) to cover a 15.7 percent gap in biennial cost increases
- Community colleges are adapting to serve evolving student needs (including mental health, food and housing insecurity)
- State support is critical to maintaining access and fostering student success
