HB 3041: Successes & Challenges Since 2017



Since 2017, **there have been many successes**, but implementation of the EAC as an intergovernmental entity has **been challenging due to administrative processes that require significant resources to maintain.**

HB 3041: Intergovernmental Agreement



An Intergovernmental agreement (IGA) is a legal agreement between local and state government bodies to work cooperatively or create an intergovernmental entity (ORS 190.110).

The EAC is created under an IGA between 4 state agencies, a school district, and an education service district.

The IGA requires regular updating as state statutes and membership change.



*For four years the IGA has needed to be updated every time there is a change to state agency, ESD, or SD membership and/or new legislation ...
Administrative gridlock ...*

HB 3041: Changing an IGA Takes 7+ Steps

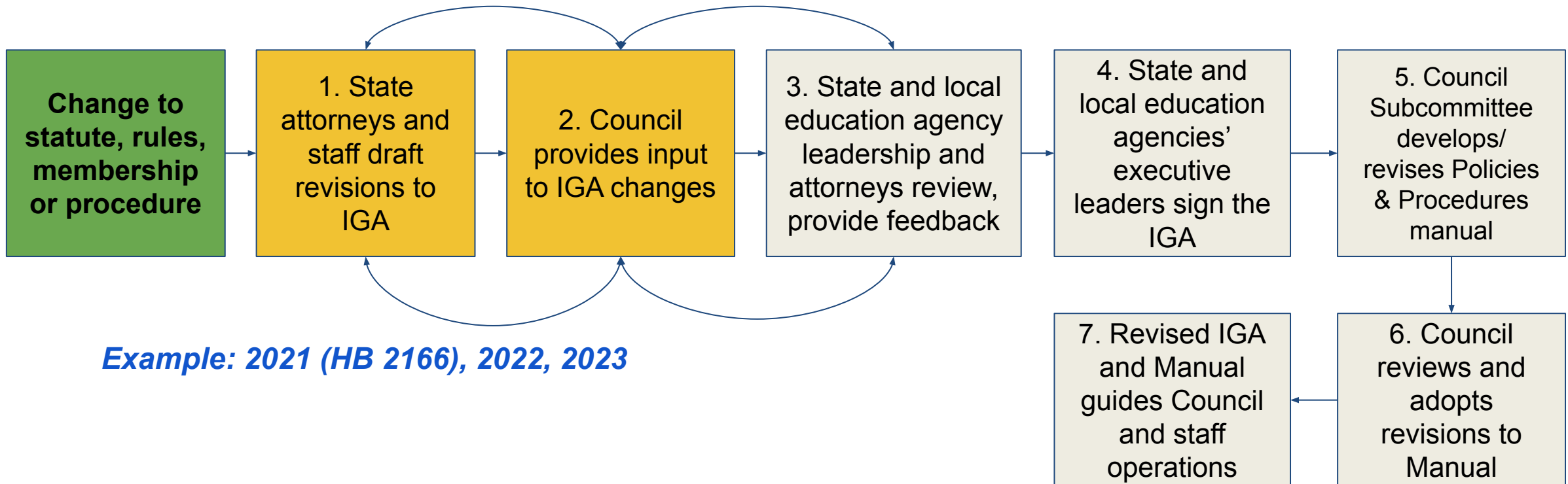


SINCE 2019 THERE HAVE BEEN:

3 State Agency Membership Changes

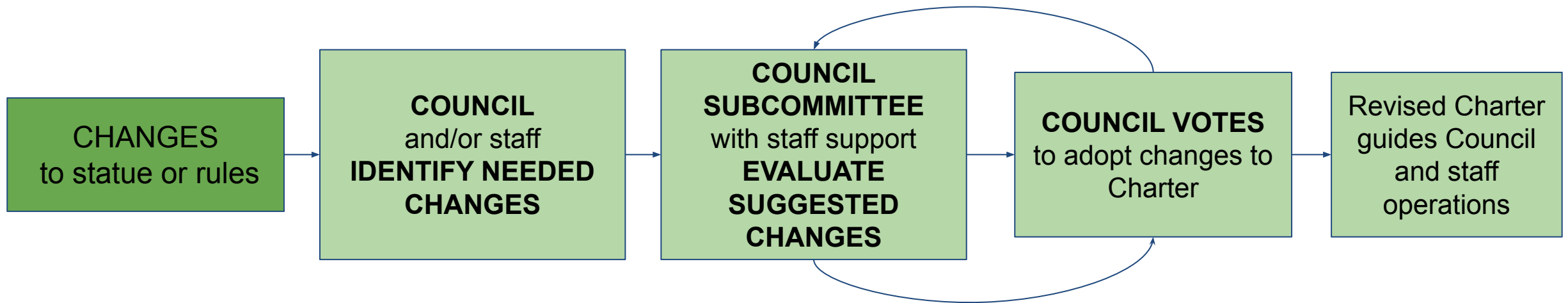


Example: 2021 (HB 2166), 2022, 2023

HB 3041: Creates a **NEW** Administrative Process

Continues to allow: Complex partnerships - **Prioritizes Educators** - Prevents a top down system

If we remove the IGA, the Council could use a new process called a **Board Charter to determine its procedures**. A charter is a written policy document prepared by a board and ideally reviewed and updated annually. It sets out the roles and responsibilities of the board members, chair, and other key roles to ensure clarity and alignment. The process would include:



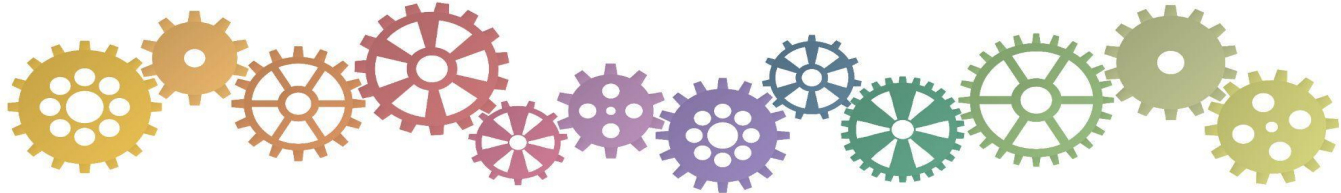
Changes to membership would no longer require changes to the governing documents of the Council

HB 3041



Legislative Concept 539 **removes use of an intergovernmental agreement (IGA)** and instead **establishes the Council in state statute**, maintaining its existing purpose and authority.
