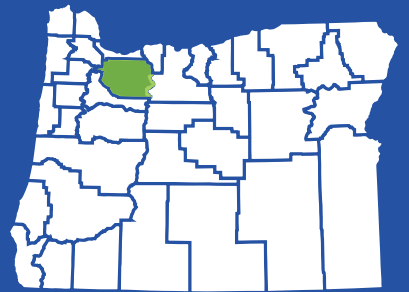

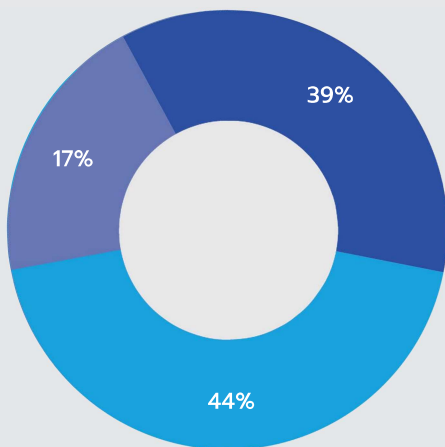

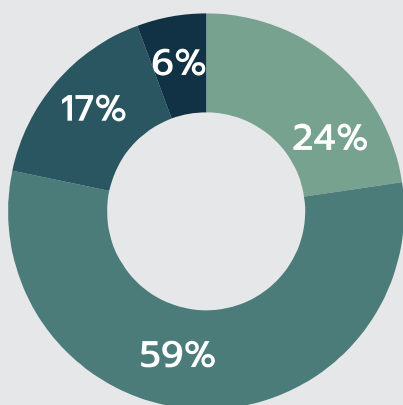
What is Columbia Gorge ESD?

Grant County ESD provides four resolution services: Special Education services (which include Speech/Language Impaired services), Technology services, Administrative and Support Services, and School Improvement services.

While many large education service districts may offer a menu of services - the ability to “pick and choose” - component districts within Grant ESD have historically shunned this model in favor of a more cooperative consortium arrangement.

This has historically allowed services to flow where most needed in times of change. The “give and take” of the structure allows districts to help build capacity where the remoteness of the population would otherwise deny service (or create a cost-prohibitive model). It is truly about providing an equitable public education to all students regardless of which district the student attends.

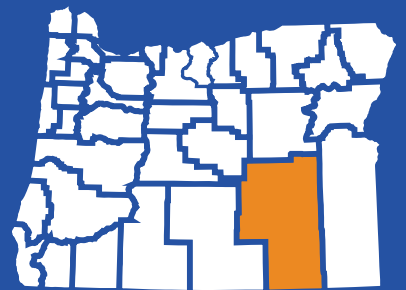

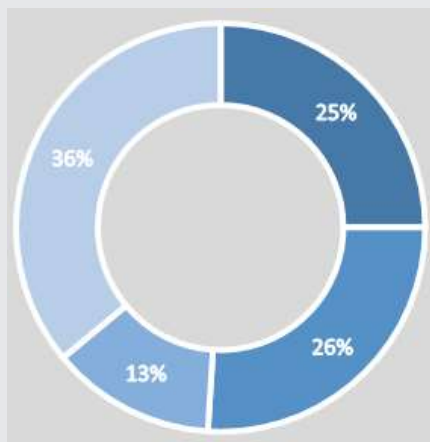
Who is High Desert Education Service District?

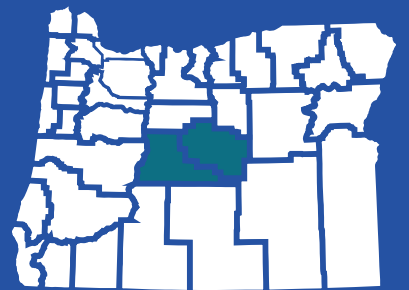
Why is HDESD Important?

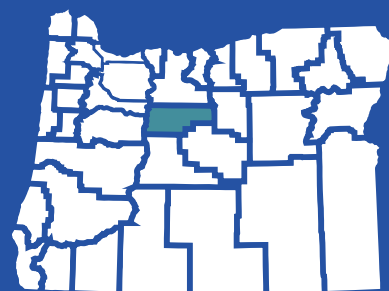
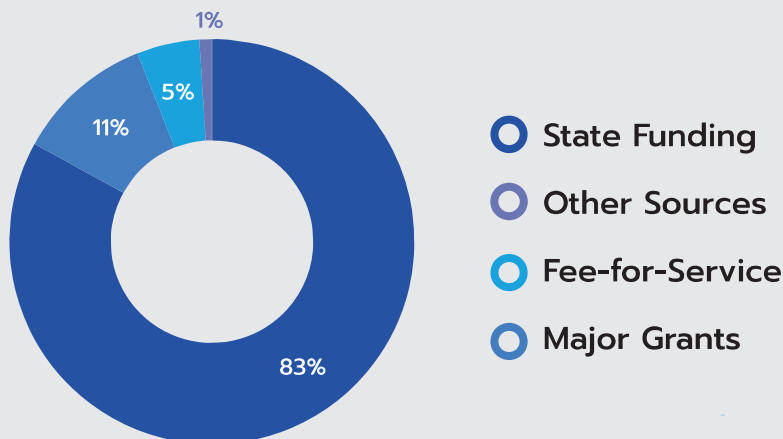
Who is Jefferson County Education Service District?

Administrative and Support Services consolidate and improve component school district business functions, liaison services between the Department of Education and component school districts and registration of children being taught by private teachers, parents, or legal guardians pursuant to ORS 339.035.

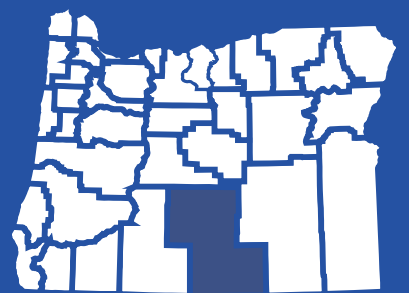
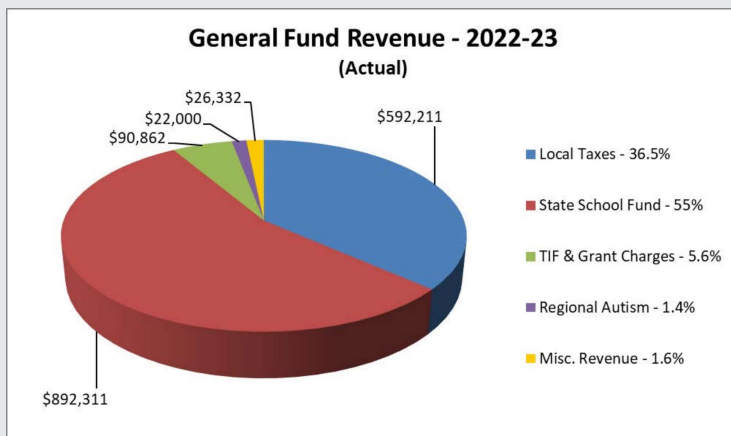
Who is Lake County Education Service District?

Located in the high desert outback of south-central Oregon, Lake County Education Service District is one of the smallest of the nineteen Oregon ESDs in terms of student population (approximately 1,016), but the fourth largest in terms of square miles (8,359). Lake County consists of five school districts with a total of nine schools. Lake County School District #7, in the town of Lakeview, has three elementary schools, one middle school, and one high school, and serves approximately 715 students. Paisley School District #11 (Paisley Public Charter School) has one K-12 school and serves approximately 66 students and a distance learning program serving approximately 130 students. North Lake School District #14 also has one K-12 school and serves approximately 218 students. Plush School District #18 (grades K-8) serves 10 students and Adel School District #21 (grades K-8) serves 10 students. Their high school students attend Lakeview High School or Paisley High School beginning with the 9th grade.

Why is Lake County ESD important?

The critical role that Lake County ESD plays in supporting small school districts in rural and remote areas. It emphasizes that these districts face significant challenges that could hinder their operations without the assistance of an Educational Service District (ESD). Lake County ESD addresses these challenges by offering specialized staff and services, which not only enhances access to quality education but also alleviates the administrative and financial burdens that the component school districts would otherwise encounter. This support is essential for the effective functioning of these districts and the overall educational landscape in Lake County.

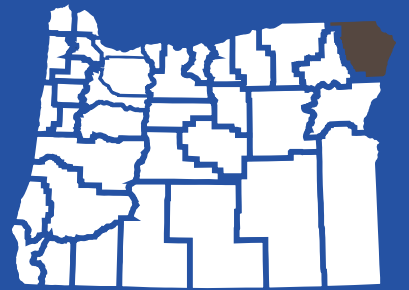


Who is Wallowa County Education Service District?

Why is Wallowa County ESD Important?

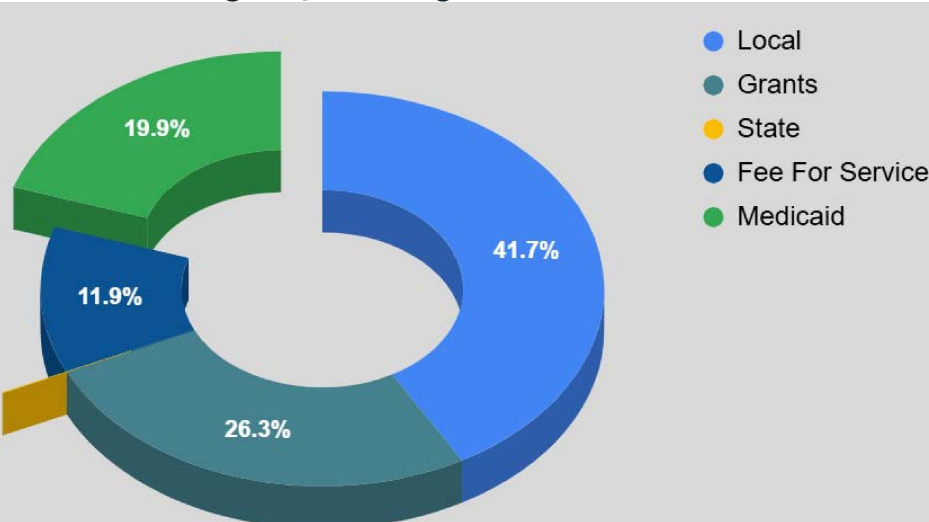

ESDs statewide provide services in:

Early Intervention (birth-3) and Early Childhood Special Education (age 3-5)

ESDs provide services for young children with developmental delays and disabilities. Eight ESDs contract with the Oregon Department of Education to offer children and their families support.

Regional Services

ESDs provide direct services to students aged birth to 21 with low-incidence disabilities such as Hearing, Vision, and Orthopedic Impairment, or Autism.

Student Success Act

ESDs provide a network of liaisons and work directly with school districts to develop and support the implementation of educational strategic plans to improve access and who have been historically underserved in the education system.

Special Education Services

ESDs provide direct instruction and related services to children and students with special needs, their families, and school districts.

School Safety and Prevention

ESDs provide a network of regional specialists to work directly with school districts to establish and provide training and consultation for a comprehensive school safety and prevention model centered on equity, racial equity, and access to mental healthcare and services.

Educator Networks

ESDs provide a collaborative network of resources to assist school districts in the recruitment and retention of quality education professionals. Mentorship and support are also provided to foster career development for these educators.

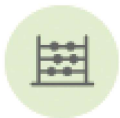
DIRECT TEACHER SUPPORT

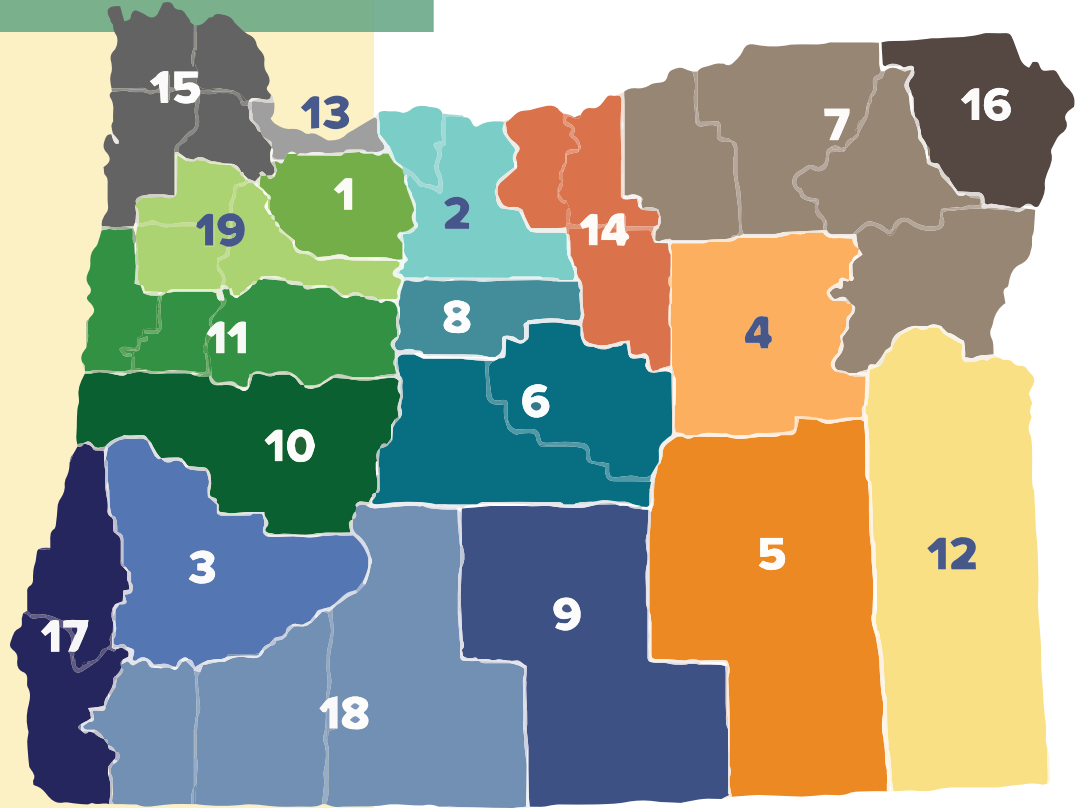
