Barriers to Program Effectiveness

- Incomplete, unclear statutory definitions result in delays or increased costs
 - For example the same notice, seizure, and storage requirements apply to boats that have been sunken for decades
- Unfeasible statutory requirements
 - For example personal property on sunken boats must be sorted, cataloged, and made available for retrieval in the exact same manner as boats that are afloat

Senate Bill 795

More Timely, Cost-Effective Removal of Hazardous Vessels

- Updates incomplete or unclear definitions
- Clarifies when vessels may be addressed as marine debris
- Allows personal property on a vessel to be stored and disposed of in the same manner as the vessel
- Lessens required storage time for seized vessels, eliminates duplicative notice requirements
