Our Responsibilities



Licensure

Maintains just under 70,000 licenses held by approximately 60,000 educators in Oregon and around the world

Professional Practices

Prior to 2024 TSPC received roughly 250 complaints each year. In 2024 this number almost doubled to 463 complaints.

Educator Preparation Program Approval

Oversees 14 Oregon-based Educator Prep programs.

Focusing on the Customer





TSPC PRIORITY: Efficiency

2024 Customer Service survey:

• 77% approval of TSPC staff response time

Contributing Factors:

- <u>Licensing</u> team received 2 additional temporary (limited duration) Public Service Representatives in interim session supporting:
 - Shorter response times
 - Appointment scheduling for those needing additional help
- <u>Investigations</u> team received 5 additional temporary (limited duration) Investigators in interim session supporting:
 - Reduction in caseload per investigator

TSPC PRIORITY: Representation

Inclusion and Belonging Opportunities:

- Expand professional opportunities to give historically excluded groups of educators voice while building community and connection
- Fill educator gap by providing differentiated supports as needed for success
- Identify and support multiple avenues for Oregon to recruit and develop outstanding educators

TSPC 2025-2027 Opportunities

Improve Service Delivery and Data Collection: Through implementation of Educator Data System, educators may more easily apply for licensure and data related to educator preparation, licensure, and accountability may more easily be retrieved and examined.

Strengthen Accountability: With SB 804, strengthen accountability by applying civil penalties to offset costs related to investigating educator misconduct.

Establish Stability: As the Commission is currently in the process of recruiting a permanent Executive Director and as new members of the Commission complete their first year of service, further stability in operations and service delivery is anticipated.
