# WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

The measure removes the references to the National CASA Association in statute. The measure requires that entities coordinating and providing court appointed special advocate services follow nationally recognized CASA standards, rather than requiring them to be members of the National CASA Association.

## BACKGROUND:

Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) and guardian ad litem (GAL) volunteers are appointed by courts to advocate for children's interests during court proceedings. <u>ORS 184.492</u> directs the Oregon Department of Administrative Services (DAS) to contract with a nongovernmental entity to coordinate the provision of court appointed special advocate services in Oregon.

<u>The National CASA Association</u> was founded in 1977 in Seattle, Washington, and changed its name to National Court Appointed Special Advocate/Guardian Ad Litem (CASA/GAL) Association for Children in 2019. <u>Oregon's</u> <u>CASA Network</u>, an affiliate of the National CASA Association, is the statewide organization that supports Oregon's 20 local CASA programs.
