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### **General Info. Regarding Facilities/Program we (Juniper Ridge) Commonly work with**

Oregon State Hospital (OSH)-Can offer the highest level of care if needed/warranted

Regional Acute Center- Class I Secure Residential Treatment Facility (SRTF)

- Shorter term stabilization- Frequently length of stay is less than 14 days.
- Residents frequently are on a mental health hold but can be voluntary.
- Increased staffing requirements- 24/7 nursing on site, provider available 24/7. Residents meet with a provider multiple times a week if not daily.
- Secure facility with minimal community interaction.
- When we were a regional acute care center and felt that someone needed a higher level of care, we would look to OSH or a larger acute care facility.

Class I SRTF

- Longer term placement- 3+ months would be typical, 6-12 months not uncommon.
- Residents are typically on commitment, guardianship, or another legal status.
- Increased staffing requirements- 24/7 nursing on site, provider available 24/7.
- Secure facility with possibility of having interaction/engagement in the community.

Class II SRTF- **Juniper Ridge** is considered this type of facility

- Longer term placement- 3+ months would be typical, 6-12 months not uncommon.
- Residents are typically on commitment, guardianship, or another legal status.
- No requirement for nursing 24/7 or having a provider available 24/7- We have a nurse on average 40 hours a week, residents meet with a provider 1-2x month.
- The closest acute care facilities to Juniper Ridge are in Bend, Boise, and Hermiston- We are at least 3 hours away from all of them.
- We are a secure facility; however, we are in the community multiple times a week with our residents.

Residential Treatment Home (RTH) 5 beds or less and Residential Treatment Facility (RTF) 6 beds or more

- Longer term placement- 3+ months would be typical, 6-12 months not uncommon.
- The same possible legal statuses as above but frequently have residents that are voluntary.
- Staffing patterns vary overall. Commonly, there is less staffing than at a SRTF, an example could be having a part time nurse for a program or a full-time nurse split amongst multiple programs.
- These facilities are unlocked. Residents commonly come and go without staff.

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
