

HOUSE BILL 2438 ENSURING FAIR MLS ACCESS

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- The current system unfairly restricts access to the Multiple Listing Service (MLS) by requiring brokers to pay costly fees to trade associations just to conduct business.
- This limits competition, drives up costs, and creates unnecessary barriers.

THE PROBLEM

- New real estate professionals struggle to afford mandatory trade association fees.
- Experienced brokers who choose not to join a trade association are blocked from MLS access.
- These restrictions stifle competition and raise costs for home buyers and sellers.

REAL-WORLD IMPACT

- HB 2438 ensures real estate licensees cannot be forced to join a trade association to access MLS services.
- MLS providers must allow access to all licensed brokers who meet eligibility requirements.

THE SOLUTION - HB 2438

- Other states such as California, Florida, and Georgia have already adopted similar laws to protect fair competition in real estate.
- In these states, brokers can pay a reasonable fee to access MLS as an alternative to membership in the trade associations.

PROVEN MODEL IN OTHER STATES

- Fewer real estate professionals will be able to operate.
- > The home buying process will slow down.
- The state may face legal challenges related to antitrust and competition laws.

- HB 2438 is about fairness, competition, and accessibility.
