Advisory Council (EPAC)

Oregon Resilience Community is NOT

Strategic 10-Year All-Hazards Vision

Mission Critical Training for Sustaining Existing  
Resilience Community

\$300,000,000 over 10-Years with \$180,000,000  
- \$200,000,000 in Capital Construction (Debt  
Services)

Phase I – DPSST Main and Core3 Project

Phase II – RFPs for Two (2) \$20,000,000 satellite  
campus projects

Phase III – RFPs for Three (3) \$20,000,000 satellite  
campus projects

# Supplements HB 2581

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## Section 18

Establishes Statewide  
Regional Training Office

Statewide Regional Training Office shall facilitate, clarify, and implement standardized training at SPARTICIS facilities located throughout the state

# Establishes Statewide Regional Training Office

Responsible for implementation of standardized training at facilities developed through SPARTICIS objectives

Ensuring grant awardees maintain established requirements

Direct delivery at facilities where DPSST deemed most capable for sustained operations
