# Oregon BHD Grant: Funding Overview

- The Oregon Behavioral Health Deflection (BHD) Grant Program was created via HB 4002 (2024).
- The Improving People’s Access to Community-based Treatment, Supports, and Services (IMPACTS) Grant Review Committee (established under ORS 430.234) was given the responsibility for distributing BHD funds and making BHD awards.

# Oregon BHD Grant: Funding Overview

- Via HB 5204 (2024), the BHD program was capitalized with \$20,708,200 to be distributed to counties and to the nine federally recognized Tribes of Oregon.
- To arrive at the appropriate funding amounts, the IMPACTS GRC followed the requirements of HB 4002, §76(6) and (7). The IMPACTS GRC had to:
  - Identify the share of grant funds that would be made available to Tribes (HB 4002 §76(6)(b)). After deliberation in early April, the IMPACTS GRC elected to set aside 10% of the funding for Tribes.
  - Determine whether to set aside up to 3% of program funds to support grantee data collection, analysis, and evaluation (HB 4002 §76(7)(c)). The IMPACTS GRC elected to set aside \$150K for this purpose because the agency received separate funding for initial data and research work for BHD.
  - Review and approve the county funding table specifying maximum grant amounts utilizing the formula set by the Oversight and Accountability Council (HB 4002 §76(6)(a)).

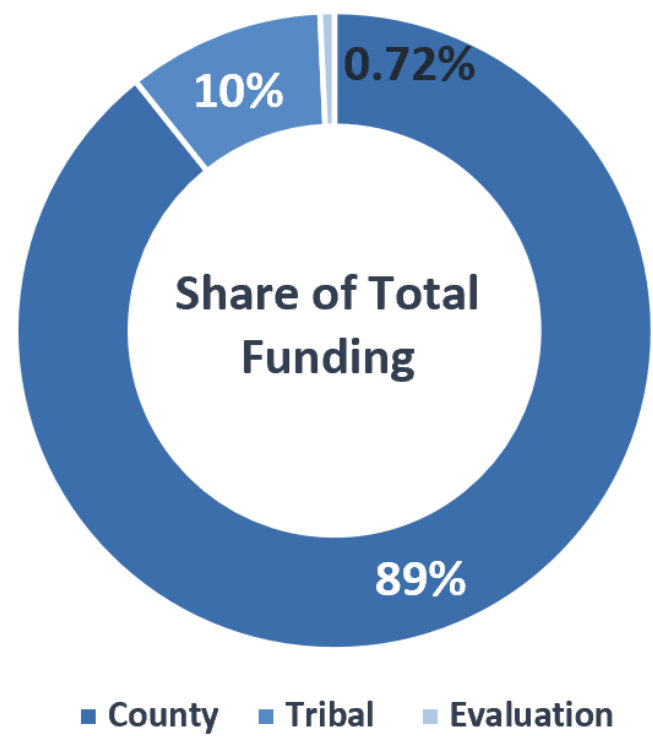
# Oregon BHD Grant: County Funding Determination

- According to HB 4002§76(6)(a), county funding shares are determined using the formula set by the OHA Oversight and Accountability Council. But, there is also a funding floor of \$150,000.
- OAC Funding Formula: this formula is used to award BM110 dollars to county BHRNs. It has four weighted components:
  - Medicaid Population (30%)
  - Homelessness Count (30%)
  - Arrests (20%)
  - Drug Overdose Deaths (20%)
- Working with OHA staff, we were able to apply the OAC percentage shares to our BHD counties. This is an iterative process, because we have to apply the formula and then bring counties up to the statutorily mandated funding floor.

# Oregon BHD Grant: Total Funding Breakdown



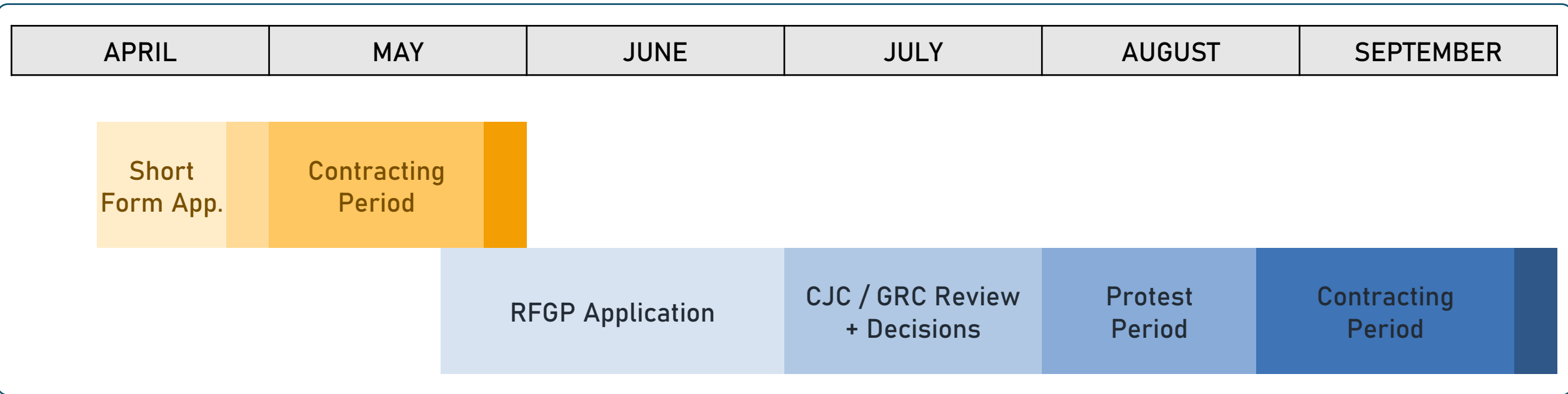
Total Available Funding: \$20,708,200
