

## HB 2991 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

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#### WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

The measure appropriates \$14 million to the Department of Human Services (DHS) for a grant program to provide funding to organizations that provide education about federal earned income tax credits and other tax benefits to low-income individuals and help low-income individuals file income tax returns and navigate tax systems. The measure declares an emergency and takes effect July 1, 2025.

#### ISSUES DISCUSSED:

#### EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

#### BACKGROUND:

In 2022, the Oregon Legislature passed [House Bill 4117](#), which appropriated \$4 million to the Oregon Department of Human Services (DHS) to provide grants to culturally specific organizations, tribal governments, and under-resourced rural community service organizations that assisted low-income households in filing tax returns. As a result of the bill, DHS established the Tax Infrastructure Grant Program. [According to DHS](#), the objective of the program is to provide free income tax services and education about income tax credits and other tax benefits to low-income households.

According to a [report](#) from the Legislative Revenue Office, most of the grant funding supports tax preparation organizations associated with the IRS's Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) sites. About 10,000 personal income tax returns were filed from grant supported organizations in 2023, increasing to about 12,600 returns for the spring 2024 tax filing season.
