#### CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Whereas Ukraine gained independence in 1991 and is a sovereign, demo-

3 cratic and law-based state that protects basic human rights and liberties; and

Whereas Article 15 of Ukraine's constitution states that Ukrainian social

life shall be "based on the principles of political, economic and ideological

6 diversity"; and

7 Whereas Article 15 further states that no ideology is recognized as man-

8 datory by the state; censorship is prohibited; and the state guarantees free-

dom of political activities not prohibited by the constitution and laws of

10 Ukraine; and

Whereas in July 2014, Ukraine was officially recognized as an ally of the

12 United States by the U.S. Senate; and

Whereas in December 2022, speaking before a joint session of the United

14 States Congress, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy thanked the

15 American people for their support of Ukraine and for their resolve for

Ukrainian independence and victory; and

17 Whereas there are more than 22,000 Ukrainian Americans in Oregon, and

18 Oregon has been a home and refuge for Ukrainian immigrants for decades;

- 1 of the Ukrainian community residing within its borders, which has brought
- 2 forth an array of talents, entrepreneurial spirit and traditions that have
- 3 deeply enriched Oregon's economy, culture and civic life; and
- 4 Whereas Oregon was among the first U.S. states to officially recognize
- 5 the tragedy of the Holodomor of 1932-1933 in Ukraine, including the passage
- of Senate Bill 583 (2023), which established Holodomor Remembrance Day;
- 7 and
- 8 Whereas approximately 4,500 Ukrainians have arrived in Oregon since
- 9 Russia invaded Ukraine in February 2022, upending their lives and forcing
- 10 them to flee the danger and destruction inflicted on their homeland; and
- Whereas Oregon's Department of Human Services plans to distribute \$2.25
- 12 million in federal grants to help refugees from war-torn Ukraine gain access
- 13 to housing assistance, employment services, health and mental health pro-
- 14 grams, legal services and aid for senior citizens; and
- 15 Whereas within Oregon, the City of Corvallis shares a sister city re-
- 16 lationship with the Ukrainian community of Uzhhorod, and the City of
- 17 Portland shares a friendship city relationship with the City of Lviv in
- 18 Ukraine; and
- Whereas more than 30 communities in Ukraine maintain a sister city or
- 20 similar relationship with communities in the United States; and
- 21 Whereas in 2024, Ihor Taburets, the Governor of Cherkasy Oblast, met
- 22 virtually with Oregon's Senate Interim Committee on Veterans, Emergency
- 23 Management, Federal and World Affairs and requested a formalized sister
- 24 state relationship between the State of Oregon and Cherkasy Oblast; and
- 25 Whereas Oregon and the Cherkasy region of Ukraine share many mutual
- values, aspirations and interests, including economic cooperation, education,
- 27 arts and culture, agriculture, energy, governance, health, biotechnology,
- 28 humanitarian assistance, environmental sustainability, science and technol-
- 29 ogy; and
- 30 Whereas Russian military forces committed an unprovoked and unjusti-
- 31 fied attack on the people of Ukraine, inflicting catastrophic loss of life and

2	Whereas on February 24, 2025, a peaceful solidarity gathering was held
3	at Pioneer Courthouse Square in Portland to mark the third anniversary of
4	Russia's invasion of Ukraine; and
5	Whereas the Legislative Assembly recognizes and thanks the many or-
6	ganizations and groups in Oregon, such as the nonprofit entity DAWN,
7	which have provided vital humanitarian aid and support to the Ukrainian
8	community; now, therefore,
9	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
10	That we, the members of the Eighty-third Legislative Assembly, support
11	the establishment of a sister state ceremonial relationship between the State
12	of Oregon and Cherkasy Oblast, Ukraine; and be it further
13	Resolved, That the State of Oregon stands in unwavering solidarity with
14	the people of Ukraine, and we condemn in the strongest terms Russia's pre-
15	meditated and unjust war against a peaceful, sovereign nation; and be it
16	further
17	Resolved, That a copy of this resolution shall be presented to the Gover-
18	nor of Cherkasy Oblast as an expression of our solidarity and commitment

to this partnership.
