Investing in Oregon's Future: Strengthening Dual Credit and Career Pathways for High School Students

- **Dedicated Advisor Support:** A specialized advisor ensures high school students enrolled in EOU's dual-credit courses receive the guidance they need to succeed, bridging the gap between high school and higher education. (Holds/Early Advising/Major Exploration)
- Expanded Rural-Urban Outreach: Current specialists would not only be able to work with isolated frontier schools, but also larger communities including La Grande, Baker City, Pendleton, Milton-Freewater, Umatilla, and Hermiston - ensuring equitable access to opportunities.
- Scaling Success Statewide: Additional funding would support a new specialist to take over larger school assignments, allowing the ECI Associate Director to focus on expanding the successful pilot framework to more institutions across Oregon.
- Building Regional HUBS in eastern Oregon: A dedicated HUB specialist would expand offerings at more schools and districts, ensuring students in eastern Oregon have the same opportunities as their peers.
- Strengthening Career & College Pathways: Increased outreach creates stronger partnerships with community colleges, CTE programs, and local industry, providing students with real-world career and education pathways tailored to the region and State's workforce needs.
