WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

The measure adds current and former members of the Oregon National Guard to existing hiring preferences for veterans of the Armed Forces of the United States applying to, or seeking promotion in, civil service positions.

Fiscal impact: Has minimal fiscal impact Revenue impact: No revenue impact

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Veteran status of National Guard members
- National Guard and service members' oaths to the Constitution
- Commitment to and recognition of service

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

Existing statute establishes that public employers shall grant preferences to veterans of the Armed Forces of the United States who apply to vacant civil service positions, or who seek promotion to a civil service position, provided the individual meets any minimum and special qualifications. Members of the National Guard are not currently covered by these provisions. For scored applications, this provides a 5 percent bonus for veterans, which increases to 10 percent for disabled veterans. Public employers not appointing a veteran to a vacant civil service position must provide their reasons for the decision upon written request by the individual.

Senate Bill 808 would include current and former members of the Oregon National Guard in provisions granting civil service hiring and promotion preferences to veterans.
