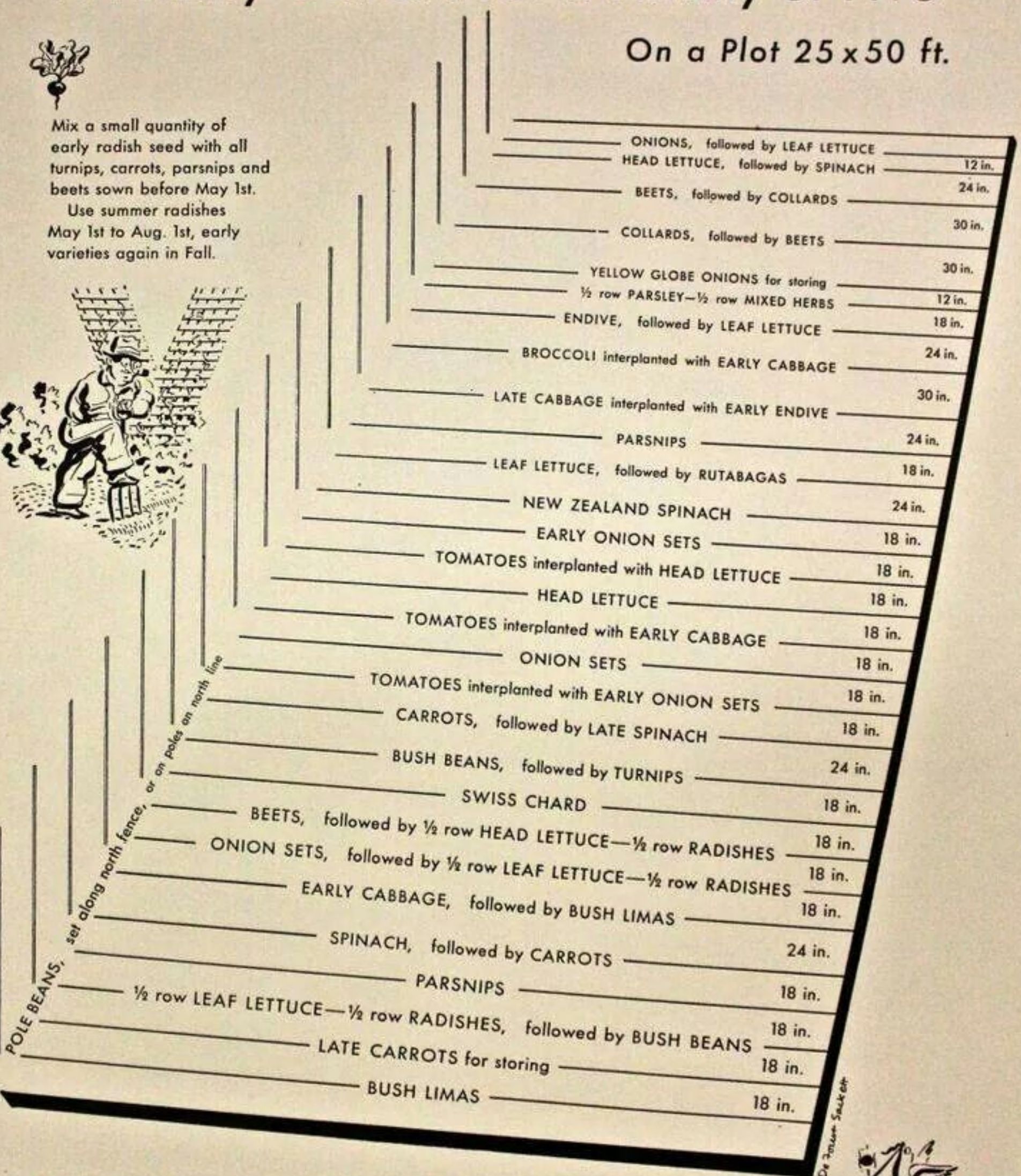
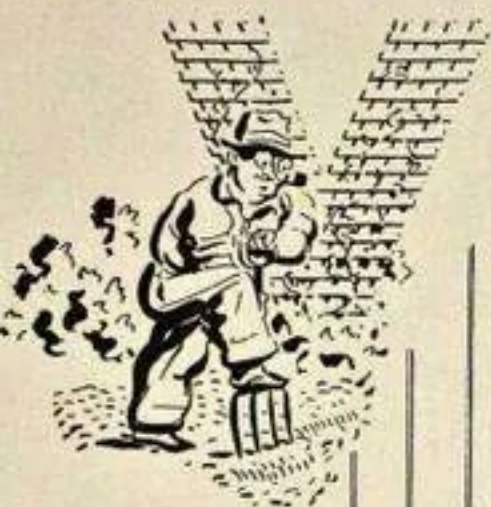
A Victory Garden for a Family of Five

Use summer radishes May 1st to Aug. 1st, early varieties again in Fall.

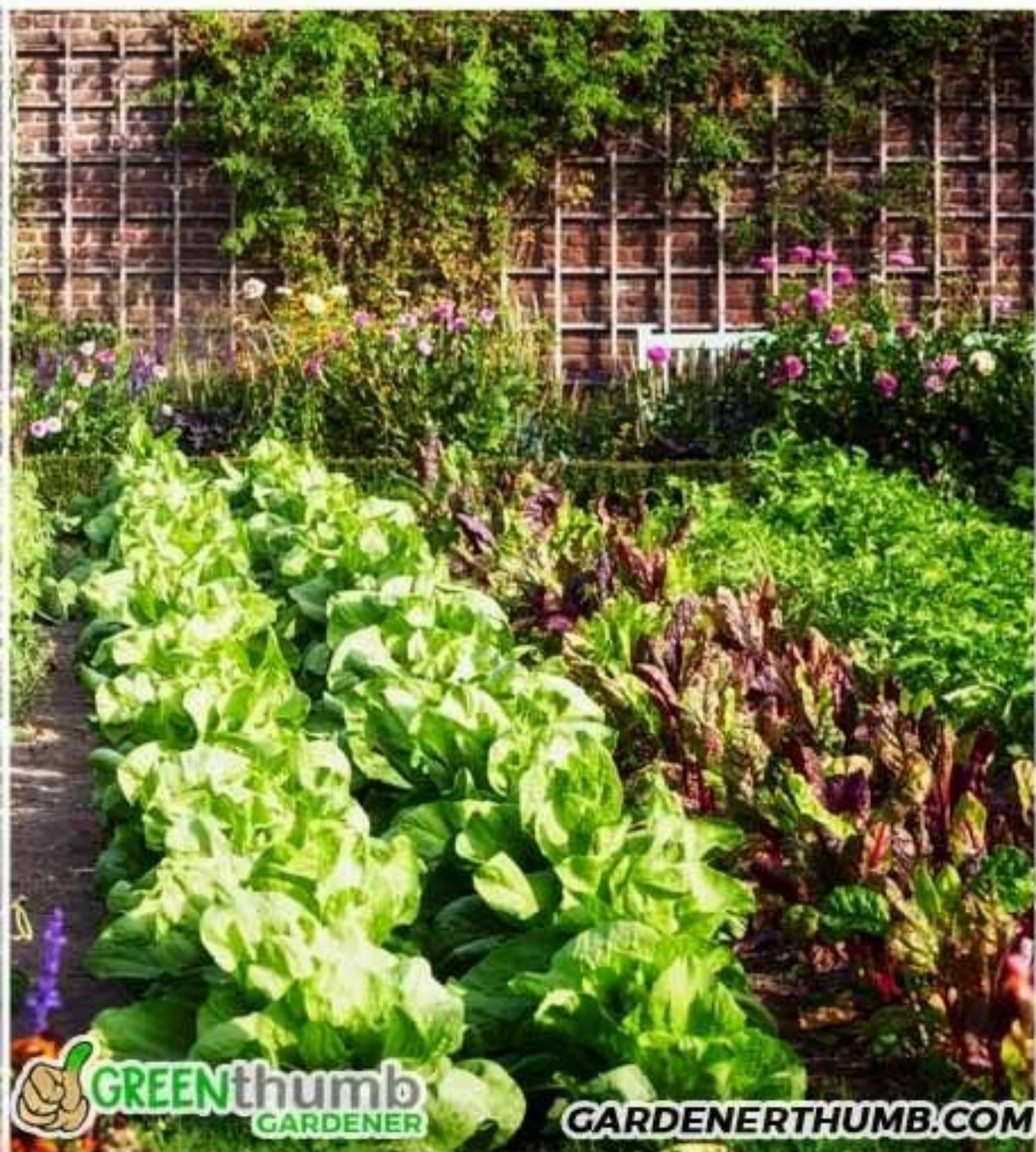
