## Bureau of Labor and Industries 2025-27 Governor's Budget Overview




- Increased work-resulting from new programs (i.e. apprenticeship programs, Paid Family Leave).
- Increased wage and hour and civil rights complaint filings leading to significant backlogs in addressing the claims.
- Ongoing funding conversation about how best to support BOLI's work in out-biennia

Expenditure History + 2025-27 Governor's Budget





#### Revenue Sources



- Mix of primarily General Fund and Other Funds
- Major sources of Other Funds include the Wage Security Fund, and in the 2025-27 Governor's budget, a one-time transfer from the Worker Benefit Fund of \$15.0 million and a \$5.0 million transfer from Oregon Business Development Department
- Some Federal and Lottery Funds present but less than five percent of agency revenues

## Bureau of Labor and Industries 2025-27 Governor's Budget



- Investments in Governor's Budget include:
  - Additional staff to support core central operations functions (Pkg 107)
  - Additional staff to enhance service delivery, strengthen workforce development programs, and improve recruitment and retention (Pkg 102)
  - Phase 2 of the Case Management Replacement Project (Pkg 101)
  - New staff in Wage and Hour and Civil Rights divisions to address workload issues funded by one-time transfer (Pkgs 130 & 140)
  - Additional expenditure limitation provided to support CHIPS Childcare payments to apprentices and journeymen (Pkg 090)
