C@P Service Priorities:

Church at the Park (C@P), serves the unsheltered in Marion & Polk Counties. C@P was formed in 2007 to interact in a relational way with people who experience homelessness. C@P has 4 functioning priorities:

Collaborative Outreach, Emergency Sheltering, Workforce Development & Supportive Housing.

National Trends

- 2023 unhoused Population: 770,000 (18% increase from previous survey)
- Oregon unhoused Population: 13% increase in 2023, 30% increase since 2017
- Oregon has 2nd highest rates of adult homelessness, 1st highest in <u>family</u> homelessness

1: Outreach & Diversion

C@P will connect vulnerable adults who are unhoused throughout the Marion Polk region to support services and start planning for long term housing, health, and income stability. Key partners include: CAA, NWHS, Bridgeway, Marion County **Health and Human Services, Northwest Senior** and Disability Services.

Adult Street Outreach Outcomes (1/1/24 - 11/30/24)

- Connected with 921 individual people
- Supported 194 people to move from the street to more stable living situations
- 47 of those people moved from the street to permanent housing

2: Housing focused Shelter

C@P will partner with all local shelter providers as well as continue to operate a 112 emergency shelter beds for vulnerable adults. The shelter will provide a safe, sanitary, and supported environment for guests to move from homelessness to stability.

The focus of our Micro-Shelter Communities is the provision of a

safe, sanitary, & supportive

environment for guests to take the next steps towards stability.



Village of Hope Outcomes (1/1/24 - 11/30/24)

- Sheltered 201 individual people
- Supported 56 people to move from the shelter to more stable living situations
- 41 of those people moved from the shelter to permanent housing

3: Stability

Vulnerable Adults will be able to stay in the shelter while they access the resources they need to stabilize and thrive in permanent housing. Through consistent C@P case management and on-site community partner connections, quests work towards stable housing, income, health, and behavioral health.

4: Launch


C@P will walk alongside shelter residents until they are ready to transition to the next stable place of living. Guests are provided mentorship and assistance to develop their long-term support systems outside of the shelter. An ideal location for many of the most vulnerable adults will be a Permanent Supportive Cottage Village location.



"Over 50% of the people we have served at Village of Hope are over 55 years old. The fastest growing group of people becoming unsheltered in our nation are over 65. And that is driven by economics, not our seniors making bad choices. The unaffordability of housing is driving our grandmas and grandpas on to the sidewalk."

Church at the Park Data Age 55+ Demographic

- Age 55+ guests have we served in the last 4 years: 484
- Age 55+ guests have we served in the last year: 319
- Age 55+ guests are we currently serving today: 55
- Age 55+ guests that are waiting in our application pool: 370





Polk County Outreach (1/1/24 - 11/30/24)

- Served 171 individual people
- Supported 24 people to move from the street to more stable living situations
- 16 of those people moved from the street to permanent housing
